# Conservative Says Howe Threatened To Quit Over Defence Production Issue

FLIN FLOON, Man. (CP)—George Hees said Monday night Defence Production Minister C. D. Howe recently threatened to resign if his cabinet colleagues did not back him in seeking an extension of his powers for defence production.

The national president of the Progressive Conservative Association spoke at a meeting of the Conservative Association of the "hill constituency."

A copy of his address was made available to the press in advance of delivery.

Mr. Hees referred to the indefinite extension of the minister's powers provided in a defence production bill which sparked a prolonged debate at the recent session of Parliament. He said the situation was resolved when Mr. Howe went fishing and Progressive Conservative leader George Drew could "work the whole thing out" privately with the prime minister.

**HOWE ALMOST ALONE**  
Mr. Hees said that it became apparent during debate on the proposed measure that the cabinet was badly split on the issue "with Mr. Howe standing alone, in a very small minority."

Mr. Hees said that with opposition to the measure in Liberal ranks it was hard to understand why the bill was being "pushed through."

"It appears that Mr. Howe is smarting from the defeat he had suffered within the cabinet this spring on the gas-pipe line issue," Mr. Hees said.

**HARRIS RISING TO TOP**  
This defeat was inflicted only after a long and bitter fight, with the opposition to Mr. Howe's plan being led by the minister of finance. The story is that Mr. Harris has gradually been displacing Mr. Howe as the dominant factor within the cabinet, and Mr. Howe is fighting a determined rear-guard action.

"As Mr. Harris was again leading the fight within the cabinet against Mr. Howe on the defence production bill, the latter became determined that on this issue he would not give way to his younger rival."

"He let it be known that if his colleagues did not back him he would resign. This they could not afford to have him do, and so the bill went forward."

**PEACE MADE**  
Mr. Hees said that as the debate continued it became apparent that the government realized it was in an untenable position and
