**MONTREAL (CP)** — Prices were steady to slightly higher on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges Thursday, recovering from earlier declines. Trading was extremely active with industrial turnover at 285,500 shares and 1,000,000 shares of 1,297,400 shares.  
The composite index rose 0.2 to 107.1, as advances outperformed declines 101 to 69 papers. Advances 0.4 to 153.8 with Price-earnings climbing 1/4 to 4.35.  
Utilities rose 0.3 to 138.1 as Interprovincial Pipe Lines advanced 1/4 to 85 and industrial advanced 0.3 to 132.3. Canada Cdn. stock index advanced 1/4 to 107.1 and Interprovincial Pipe Lines advanced 1/4 to 149.4.  
Banks were unchanged at 125.8 and Hudson Bay Mining moved up 1/4 to 66 1/2 among paper base metals. Hollinger fell 1/4 to 20 1/2.  
In food and beverage issues, Orlive Flour and Salada Foods advanced 1/4 to 15 1/2 and 12 1/2. C.A.E. advanced 1/4 to 9 1/2 among machinery issues.  
In senior oils Home A climbed 1/4 to 2.25. Dania sourled 1/4 to 1.94 among primary metals and commodities.  
In speculative mines on the Canadian exchange six cents to 76 cents. Silver and tin rose 1/2 to 18 cents, and Equity Exploration two cents to 18 cents on 200,000 shares traded. Black Hawk fell 15 cents to \$1.

**TORONTO (CP)** — Profits played a cat-and-mouse game with the market Thursday as first one section would move higher and then another would swoop into selling as the session wore on. Trading was active with 3,840,000 shares changing hands Wednesday. Western oils probably had most of the game. At one point the index was up 2.22 to 103.02, but it closed with a 1.01 gain at 101.81. Home B gained 1/4 to 22 1/2.  
Best performer among speculative issues was Macdonald, which turned over 672,724 shares and gained five cents to 35 cents. Bellfleur fell nine cents to 75 cents and Marchand 10 cents to \$1.25.  
Among Industrials O'h a w a Wholesale A jumped 2 1/2 to 57 1/2 while Duce added 1/2 to 10 1/2. Interprovincial Pipe Line and Algoma gained 1/4 to 85 1/2 and 62 1/2 respectively.  
Among mining issues, Leitch gained 60 cents to \$4.35 while the other two, Highland and Highland, gained 40 cents to \$6.00 more.
