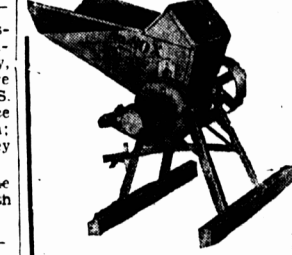
The regular meeting of Coronation Women's Institute met at the home of Mrs. Fred Bernard on Dec. 14.
