

Boston Shuts Out Indians Yankees Slaughter Tigers

Boston Red Sox picked up their first triumph in five starts with a 6-0 shutout of Cleveland Wednesday as Frank Sullivan checked the injury-plagued Indians on five hits.

Solo home runs by Jim Piersall and Sammy White and lax Cleveland fielding contributed to the whitewashing.

New York Yankees slaughtered Detroit's hurling with 15 hits—including a two-run homer by Gil McDougald and a three-run round-tripper by Yogi Berra—while Tom Sturdivant held the Tigers to eight hits for a 10-2 victory.

Chicago Cubs rode successive eighth-inning homers by Ernie Banks and Moose Moryn to a 4-3 second game victory to sweep a doubleheader from Philadelphia in the only National League daytime action. Rookie Dick Drott limited the Phillies to three hits in a 9-0 triumph in the opener.

McDougald's homer into the lower left field stands at Yankee Stadium in the fifth inning after an error by Frank Bolling on Bobby Richardson's grounder.

In the seventh the Yanks scored four. McDougald tripled and

Mickey Mantle doubled. After Elston Howard filed deep to left, moving Mantle to third. Bill Skowron was walked intentionally. Berra followed with a homer into the right field ball pen to chase Lou Sleater who had taken over from loser Duke Maas.

Indians' rookie centerfielder Roger Maris retired when he was hit above the left eye with the ball in the eighth at Boston. It was thrown by catcher White.

Boston beat starter Mike Garcia with a four-run uprising in the fourth inning which reflected the burly righthander's poor support.

Billy Klaus singled to left and after Ted Williams filed deep to Maris in right centre, Mickey Vernon dropped a pop fly single among the confused Cleveland pursuers — Bobby Avila, Maris and Rocky Colavito.

Piersall tagged his seventh homer of the year in the fifth White got his in the seventh.

LOWN SAVES WIN
Veteran Turk Lown saved the second game for Moe Drabowsky after the Phillies loaded the bases with one out in the ninth inning. Lown preserved Moe's fourth win by striking out Joe Lonnett, Phil-

lies' rookie catcher, and pinch-hitter Mary Blaylock.

The Phillies moved ahead in the eighth on a walk and singles by Richie Ashburn and Solly Hemus. Twenty-year-old Drott won the Cubs' first shutout of the year in the first game.

The Phillies' three hits off Drott included Ed Bouchee's wrong field double with two out in the first; Rip Repulski's infield pop fly that dropped between Bobby Morgan and Bob Speak for a gift single to open the eighth, and Gran Hamner's single after Ashburn drew the last of Drott's two walks in the ninth.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Kansas City clustered three runs Wednesday night in the ninth inning off Russ Kemmerer, with Billy Martin slugging a two-run homer, as the Athletics defeated Washington, 6-3.

Virgil Trucks won his sixth victory in relief, although requiring aid from Tom Morgan in the ninth. Vic Power started the ninth inning, which he singled to left. Joe DeMastra sacrificed and Trucks singled to left, scoring Power. Martin then smashed a home run into the left-field bleachers.

Trucks got in trouble with one out in the ninth when he walked Herb Pless and Pete Runnels successively, but Morgan replaced him and Roy Sievers hit into a force play. Jim Lemon sent a game-ending pop fly to Martin.

MILWAUKEE (AP) — Bobby Buhl hurled his fourth four-hitter Wednesday night, posting his third straight victory as the Milwaukee Braves broke their three-game losing streak with a 6-0 victory over the sixth-place New York Giants.

Buhl now has seven victories and two losses, both of them shutouts by the Giants. He has won five of his six last decisions.

The only hits off Buhl were singles by Andre Rodgers, Daryl Spencer, Whitey Lockman and the losing pitcher, Ruben Gomez.

Gomez suffered his fourth loss against nine victories this season, giving up seven hits and being charged with five runs.

The Giants hurler left in the fifth inning after Billy Bruton tripled and scored on Red Schoendienst' double. Jim Davis took over with one man out and issued a walk, a three-run homer by Wes Covington and two more walks before he was replaced by Al Worthington, who retired the side.

Joe Brown Beats Orlando Zulueta

DENVER (AP) — Lightweight champion Joe Brown successfully defended his title Wednesday night at Denver Coliseum with a technical knock-out in the 15th round over challenger Orlando Zulueta of Havana, Cuba.

The bout came at two minutes, 39 seconds of the final round.

The valiant little Cuban, who had matched punch for punch with Brown most of the fight and opened a cut over the champion's right eye in the 10th, went down first in the 13th round for a nine count.

Referee Ray Keech stopped the fight after the challenger had got to his feet at the count of nine in the 15th round.

The crowd boomed loudly when Keech halted the battle. But to ringsiders there was no doubt it was all over.

Zulueta made it clear that a left hand isn't always enough. He stabbed Brown frequently but Brown hoded his time. And when he saw his spot he boomed in with a load of right and left hooks that was too much for the Cuban to bear.

Brown weighed 134½ and the challenger 133½.

Zulueta came in the ring an unofficial 8-to-5 underdog.

Brown seemed puzzled at the Cuban's early swarming tactics but stuck with his plod-and-punch routine which pays off when he lands the big one.

Zulueta hit Brown with his right frequently in the early rounds but it lacked the necessary power and Brown shrugged them off.

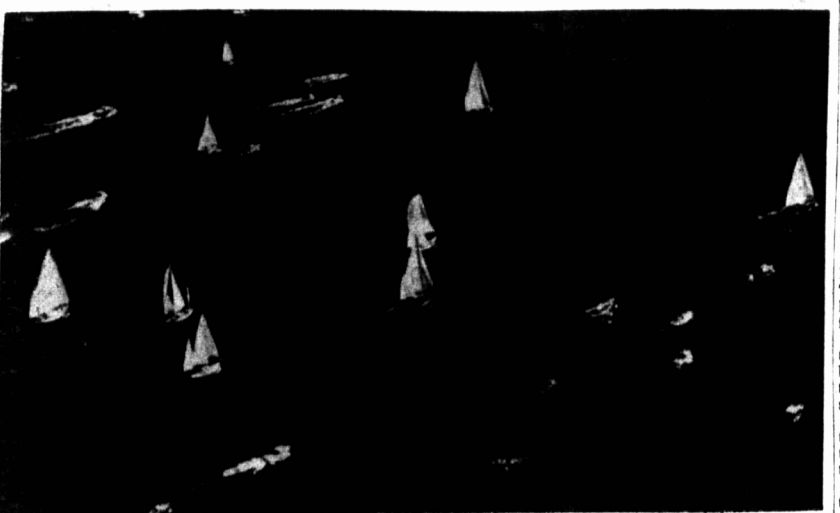

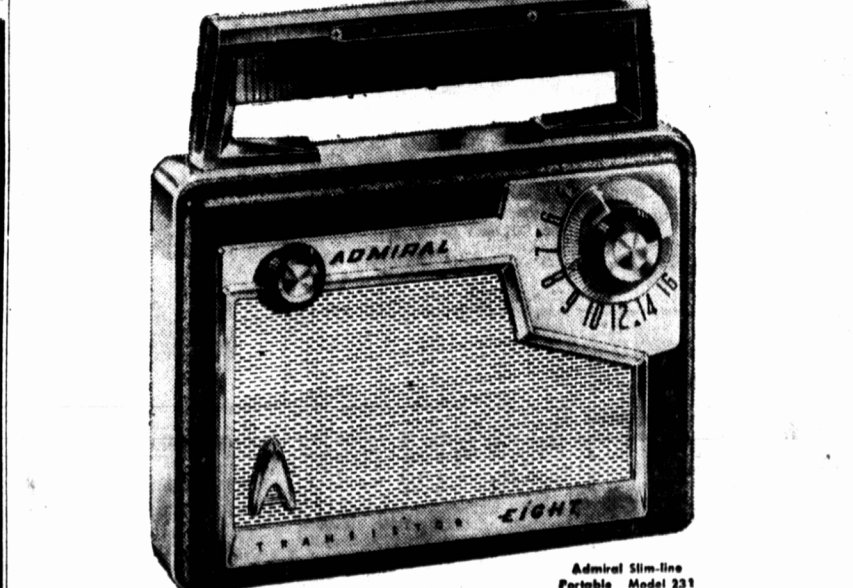
