BY-LAW TO AMEND THE BY-LAW TO REGULATE TRAFFIC

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTETOWN AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the By-law to Regulate Traffic in the City of Charlottetown be amended by adding the following thereto as section 22 thereof:

22A. Notwithstanding anything otherwise appearing in this By-law if and where any street approaching an intersection is marked off into three traffic lanes every vehicle approaching and entering the intersection on such street shall proceed as follows:

Vehicles turning right in the intersection shall approach in the right hand lane and turn right into the right hand lane of the intersecting street, especially guarding all pedestrians.

Vehicles continuing straight through the intersection shall approach in the centre lane and leave the intersection in the right hand lane.

Vehicles turning left in the intersection shall approach in the centre lane and turn left into the right hand lane of the intersecting street as other traffic may allow, especially guarding all pedestrians.

Designation of lanes (i.e. "right-hand") is in relation to the direction of the vehicle.

Vienna Papers Praise Photo

VIENNA, (AP)—Vienna newspapers today praised an Associated Press photo showing Russian and American soldiers working shoulder-to-shoulder against the Danube floods. Editorials said this shot of the first real co-operation between the rival troops since 1945 would "go around the world."

Photographer Harry Wechsberger snapped the picture of U.S. Army Sergeant E. W. Norris and an unidentified Soviet infantryman unloading rocks Tuesday from a Soviet truck at Langenlebern, Austria. The Russian and U. S. soldiers had both responded to calls for help, without realizing they would meet each other, when flood waters menaced Langenlebern and the nearby U. S. air force base at Tulln, 22 miles northeast of Vienna.

Every Vienna newspaper used the picture Wednesday, including the Communist press.

In West Germany, many newspapers front-paged the picture. The Hessische Nachrichten captioned the picture:

"Why isn't it always like that? Couldn't it be like that in world politics also?"

Announce New Hospital Grants

OTTAWA, (CP)—The health department announced hospital grants totalling \$150,000 Thursday, including a \$75,000 contribution towards a new 150-bed nurses residence at Weyburn, Sask.

The second largest grant, \$50,777 will go to a cancer diagnostic and treatment centre at St. Joseph's Hospital, Trois-Rivieres, Que.

The funds, to be matched by a provincial grant, will assist in staffing and equipping the centre.

The Oakville-Trafalgar Memorial Hospital, Oakville, Ont., will receive \$10,333 for an addition which will increase accommodation by seven treatment beds and 12 bassinets.

A \$3,800 grant will assist Toronto hospitals in research dealing with complications in pregnancy among women of certain blood types.

Ottawa Mayor Considers Offer

OTTAWA (CP)—Charlotte Whitton, mayor of Ottawa, said Thursday she hasn't made up her mind whether to quit politics or accept an attractive job offer.

Miss Whitton didn't say what the job would be except that it would involve a good deal of travelling throughout the Commonwealth, would be most lucrative and that it would be "in my line" of welfare and social work. City elections will be held in December.

Purchase Site For New Brewery

TORONTO (CP)—C. O. Dalton, president of Carlings Breweries, announced Thursday that the company has purchased a 117-acre site in suburban Etobicoke for a new brewery.

It was reported unofficially that cost of the new plant might run to \$10,000,000 and that a start might be made before the end of 1955.

Mr. Dalton's announcement said when the new plant is finished it might affect operation of the present brewery in Toronto but it would not affect plants in Montreal, Teutsemh, Ont., and Water- loo, Ont.
