concern for the least and greatest of us is revealed in the history of Israel in the lives of great religious figures—in the visions of His prophets, and supremely in the birth, life, teaching, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus Christ the power, wisdom and might of God brought to bear upon our lives. A created order presupposes a Creator. And the Creator still abides with and watches over His creation, including our own lives, and although we understand Him and His purpose only well enough to obey Him and find peace of heart and a continuous growth and expansion of our lives.

We can see, therefore, how foolish it is for us to question God's judgment and fall into doubt and despair because we cannot perfectly understand His ways. We should not let our faith be impaired because we cannot understand God and the heavenly order perfectly. God neither asks nor expects this of us, for the human mind is incapable of grasping the infinite truths of the nature of God. We can understand enough to bow before Him and be guided by His majesty, wisdom, power and holy purpose. The rest we must accept on faith. Let us exercise our faith and use it to support us in a sincere attempt to understand divine truth better and to apply it to the everyday problems of our lives.

German Church Shows The Way

A few weeks ago the Protestant churches of West Germany approved a call for a new spirit of co-operation between Germany and Poland. They urged review of the troubled questions of frontiers, exiles and refugees in "a true dialogue and an expression of the will to reconciliation."

Jobs For Welfare Recipients Being Planned By Provinces

By KEN KELLY OTTAWA (CP)—With federal financial aid, the provinces are planning experiments in helping some welfare recipients to become productive members of society.

The experiments go under the name of work activity programs and, for the first time, the federal government has agreed to pay part of the costs. Informants said here the impetus for these programs came from Saskatchewan and Newfoundland. Agreement was reached at last week's ministerial conference on the Canada Assistance Plan under which Ottawa will play half the provincial costs.

While still in the planning stages, provincial programs are expected to be ready to qualify for federal aid by the time Parliament approves the Canada Assistance Plan legislation.

ent will graduate into the labor force, thus getting him off the welfare rolls. The programs are expected to meet two needs—those of persons who will never be able to work at comparable capacity with their fellows, such as the retarded, and those who have special social problems which render them labor market casualties. Britain and the United States have work activity programs. In Britain they are conducted through re-establishment centres. It is probable some provinces will model their programs on the British system.
