Truax 2:06 1/4. Others he has for sale are Clarinda Grattan 2:12, a brood mare in foal to Widow's Pride 2:06. Widow's Pride is probably not as much appreciated in the Maritimes as he deserves for without doubt he was one of the great two-year-olds the year he raced. He is a son of Abbedale 2:01 1/4, one of the world's greatest sires of speed, and the famous race mare Widow Grattan 2:00 and is an own brother to The Widower 1:59 1/4, that showed his heels to both King's Counsel 1:58 and Adios 1:57 1/4 as a two-year-old. Mr. McGinley breeds, buys and sells and is considered one of the most reliable horsemen in the Pine Tree State.

A horse that is attracting a great deal of attention at Roosevelt Raceway this season is Shady Hanover, a seven-year-old brown gelding by Real Money, dam, Emily Hanover by Sandy Flash. In a classified pace, purse \$2,000, recently, he headed such redoubtable pacers as Ankavay 2:02, Upland 2:04 1/4, Robert Morris 2:00 and three other stars in 2:04 3/5. The sire, Real Money, is a full brother of Cold Cash 1:58 1/4 and he is now owned by Johnny Gay of Montague.

George MacDonald, Boston, Mass., sends us summaries of races at Foxboro and Scarborough. At the former place Little Train, driven by Dannie Steele, was second in the 2:28 Trot for three-year-olds. He is sired by Fast Train and is looked on as a possible star. The same night at Foxboro Wayoff (Clark) won the three-year-old and up race for \$600, heading Annabelle Senah (also five-nell) and Private George, also five-nell. This 2:05 1-5 is a new track record for Foxboro. Readers will remember that June Morning headed practically the same field at Skowhegan a short time ago in 2:04 3-5. The former track record was 2:06 1-5 made September 25th, 1948, by Nancy Wyeth.

In the list of speed ratings of various tracks based on one mile in 2:06 1/4, the following ratings appear in the official program for Foxboro—Foxboro, 2:07 1/4; Goshen, 2:04 1/4; Roosevelt Raceway, 2:04 1/4; Batavia, 2:10; Buffalo, 2:07; Maplewood, 2:06 1/4; North Michigan, 2:06 1/4; Rosecroft, Md., 2:07; Saratoga, 2:06 1/4. All the above are half-mile tracks. Thus it will be seen that even in the expensive constructed tracks in the United States, built by experts, there is considerable difference in the time it takes to negotiate a mile by a fast record horse even if he is in the most perfect condition when he appears at any of these raceways. When people discuss speed and tracks in this Province they must take into consideration that the footing and other factors can make a very great difference in the time taken to negotiate 1,760 yards—one mile.

We had a pleasant surprise a few mornings ago when a letter arrived from Walker S. Found, Mercer, California—"My stable has done fairly well this season although my pacing mare, Warme P., that was expected to race close to two minutes, met with an accident during her race at Santa Anita where the heats were won in 2:01 1-5 to 2:02 3-5. She has recovered from that now and will take part in several big stakes next month. My best out winner this season was Santa Perk Axworthy by Perk Axworthy, sire of Vita Lee 2:02 1-5, Patchen Axworthy 2:01 3-5 and a number of others that raced from 2:03 to 2:05. He won \$2,350 at the Santa Anita meeting and is a right decent race horse, that will go the last eighth of a mile in 2:05 from behind in 14 seconds. He is a rich, deep chestnut with markings, a remarkably good looking showy trotter in his slow miles, and I have worked him in 2:10 with the hoppers. If it were not so far away I would like to send him to you, you would race him a year or two and I think he would be a real acquisition to the breeding industry on the Island. I could easily make up an express carload of prospects, yearlings and two-year-olds, mostly by Peter Primrose 2:01 1/4, one of the last sons of Peter Volo, sired by Prudential, the last son of Mr. McElwain.

"The Prudentials look like real trotters. Prudential McKie has won in 2:04 4-5 and Prudential Sue in 2:03 3-5. I have a three-year-old, Prudent Found, that is entered in both \$2,500 futurities to be raced at Sacramento next month. Our sport here would be on a much better basis if night racing could be introduced, but the owners of thoroughbreds have a strange hold and trotting associations are forced to accept dates suitable and agreeable to the thoroughbred interests.

"You may have noted that a two-year-old colt, Mr. Primrose by Peter Primrose, showed up well at Santa Anita and has also won his class at Baltimore, Md. He was born on my farm and his dam, Miss Security, is again in foal to Peter Primrose. I am going to spend more time with the horses in future and less time on other things. The spirit moves me occasionally to write and then I don't know when to stop, but I can conscientiously say that I wish I could cut down for Old Home Week and do a little catching up on conversation with the many friends of former days in the Garden of the Gull." Thanks, Walter, and we will be hoping to hear from you again and learn the result of your racing, and wouldn't we like to train and drive Santa Perk Axworthy here—well I

Colt Futurities Scheduled Next Friday Night

TO BE RACED AT CHARLOTTE-TOWN TRACK FRIDAY NIGHT, SEPTEMBER 8th.

Next Friday night under the lights the Prince Edward Island Harness Club colt futurities for 1950 carrying total purses of \$3,000 will be raced at the Charlottetown oval. It is the largest amount of money ever offered for these stakes and has attracted an entry list of 46 two-year-olds, three-year-olds and four-year-olds, trotters and pacers.

A number of years ago some far-sighted horsemen organized these stakes with the object of encouraging the training of young trotters and pacers. The success accomplished through the years has been truly remarkable and one has only to go back in memory to recall the many fast ones that have been developed as a result of these events. Take for instance June Morning 2:04 1-5, the fastest pacing mare ever bred in the Maritimes. She raced in these futurities as a three and four-year-old, and we could easily recall dozens of others that have left their imprint on the record books in no uncertain way. It is regrettable that the late Lt.-Col. J. P. Hooper, M.C., could not be with us to witness these events again, for he took a deep interest in them; fortunately he had associated with him W.G. Gillespie as Secretary-Treasurer. "Bill" has carried the load this year and it has been a heavy one and owners and drivers certainly must give him credit for the time and effort he has put into this work.

In addition to the purses, amounts of which are shown under the events there will be distributed the sum of at least \$170 to non-winners, that is to say \$10 to every starter that fails to get in the money. The following generous horsemen have provided trophies for the winners of each event—Roy Bevan, H. J. Kennedy, H. S. Stables, W. G. Gillespie, Frank McKay, and Dr. F.C. Dougan.
