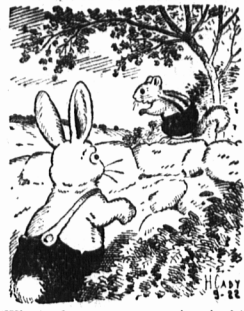
STRIPED CHIPMUNK BEGINS EARLY

Table showing bidding sequence: South West North East.

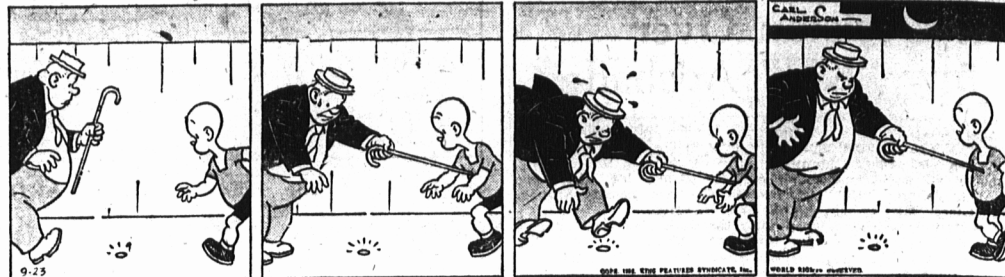
After West's opening lead of the heart deuce, South gave careful consideration to his problem; then he put up the heart ace and ruffed a heart with the club ace.

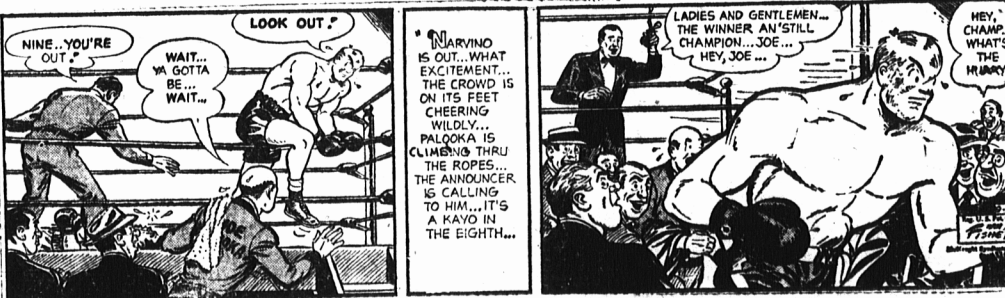

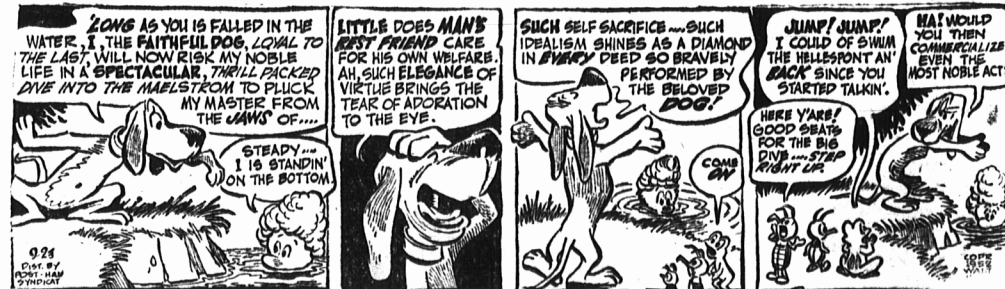
