That is she had neither been inspected nor registered as provided by law. It is said that only a few days since the authorities became cognizant of her existence and had her tied up. Many persons will, doubtless, consider it strange that the Government should patronize to such an extent (or at all) a steamer that had no legal right to run. But Sir Louis has a weakness for looking after his relatives, and he, evidently does not believe in allowing such a small matter as the inspection of a steamer to prevent his so doing.

STREET LIGHTING IN SOURIS.

SIR,—As we have no paper published in our town, I hope you will allow me to refer to one of the many grievances that our citizens are now enduring. I refer to our street lighting. The others I will take up later. The taxpayers of the town were given to understand that an arrangement was made with those who had street lamps opposite their place of business or residence to light them for a certain amount per month. As a matter of fact they have not been lit for three nights this summer—with one or two exceptions. In the first place, admitting they were lit according to agreement, nine-tenths of the town say the principle is wrong. In the second place they say that lamp-posts should not be allowed to be placed, except at the owner's expense, in front of any place of business or residence, but at the street corners where they will do the most good, and where you will always find them in all well-regulated hamlets. Now, I understand that our city fathers meet in secret conclave, somewhere on some night in the month, and I would suggest that they take this matter up. Let them have these lamp-posts removed to street corners, for they are not the individual property of anyone; and I would further suggest that the lighting of those lamps be let by tender. Then the citizens would see and appreciate the fact that they are receiving some benefit—at least for the taxes they pay into the civic treasurer's hands.

It is really too bad that strangers and citizens alike are often compelled on dark nights to walk in the middle of the streets rather than feel their way on the sidewalks. It is to be hoped that our wardens will wake up have lamp-posts placed at street corners and not in the middle of blocks; and also see that they are regularly lit.
