# CITIZENSHIP ROUTE LONG

TORONTO (CP) — Italian-born opera singer Andrea Zazzano has followed a turbulent path to Canadian citizenship and, he hopes, peace at 58. The 58-year-old singer, who says he has lost more than \$9,500,000 among other things, through the misfortunes of war and revolution, became a Canadian citizen last week.

Today he's general manager of an Italian record store in the city.

Mr. Zazzano says he was destined to be a house painter but started instead on a singing career in Rome when he was 20.

By 1941, when he was 31, his singing had amassed him a fortune and he was a businessman in Ethiopia when he became a British prisoner of war. He says the Second World War cost him \$7,500,000.

Following the war he returned to Italy to marry but found his fiancée had been killed. He again took up singing and settled in Argentina, where he invested in several businesses and became a friend of Evita Peron, wife of the then dictator, Juan Peron.

In 1955 when Peron was overthrown, Mr. Zazzano says he was forced to flee, and lost about \$2,000,000. He settled in Venezuela where, he says, he was forced to abandon four apartment buildings he owned when revolution swept the country in 1958. He moved to Cuba just in time for Fidel Castro's revolution.

From Cuba he came to Toronto, where he filled singing engagements and was signed to sing on a round-the-world cruise in a Greek liner.

Now he's back in business again—this time he hopes in peace and for good.
