**NOTICE OF HEARING and Proposal For Revision of Tolls**

1. Notice of Public Hearing: Notice is hereby given that The St. Lawrence Seaway Authority will conduct a hearing on a proposed revision of the charges in the St. Lawrence Seaway Toll of Tolls Schedule, as established in 1952. The proposal is put forward by the Authority and the Saint Lawrence Seaway Development Corporation of the United States of America following a study of estimated future traffic and a general review of the sufficiency of present tolls. The hearing will be held at the Supreme Court Building, Wellington Street, Ottawa, beginning at 10:00 a.m. on May 25, 1966, and continuing in daily session from 10:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. and 2:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. (E.D.S.T.) until concluded, subject to being recessed from day to day or otherwise at the discretion of the Authority.

SCHEDULE		
1. For transit of the Seaway, a composite toll, comprising:	Montreal to or from Lake Ontario	Lake Ontario to or from Lake Erie (Welland Canal)
(a) a charge per gross registered ton, according to the national registry of the vessel, applicable whether the vessel is wholly or partially laden, or is in ballast:	25% in U.S. dollars	25% in Canadian dollars
(b) A charge per ton of cargo, as certified on ships' manifest or other documents, as follows:		
(i) bulk cargo (restricted to listed commodities in lots of 100 tons or more)	.44	.02 (suspended)

(c) a charge per passenger	4.00	4.00
(d) subject to the preceding provisions of this item, minimum charges shall be:		
(i) Pleasure Craft	21.00	24.00

2. For partial transit of the Seaway:

(a) Between Montreal and Lake Ontario, in either direction, 15 per cent per lock of the toll under item 1, with a charge of \$3.00 per lock for pleasure craft transits and \$5.00 per lock for the transit of other vessels.

(b) Between Lake Ontario and Lake Erie (Welland Canal), in either direction, 50 per cent of the toll under item 1, provided that no toll will be assessed unless at least one lock is transited, with a minimum charge of \$12.00 for pleasure craft transits and \$20.00 for the transit of other vessels. No toll will be assessed for transits of Lock 1 of the Third Welland Canal at Port Dalhousie.

3. Welland Canal, lockage charge—applicable in lieu of Lake Ontario-Lake Erie charges per gross registered ton:

4. Future Traffic Estimates, Toll Requirements and Annual Traffic Reports. Copies of the Summary of Future Traffic Estimates and Toll Requirements, prepared by the Seaway Entities on the basis of their joint study of the sufficiency of Seaway tolls, and the Annual Traffic Reports of the St. Lawrence Seaway Authority, may be obtained by writing to the Secretary, The St. Lawrence Seaway Authority, 396 Cooper Street, Ottawa 4, Ontario.

5. Presentation of Oral Testimony: Persons or organizations desiring to present oral testimony at the hearing shall submit their Notice of Appearance (in 10 legible copies) prior to May 15, 1966, to the St. Lawrence Seaway Authority, 396 Cooper Street, Ottawa 4, Ontario. (Attention: Secretary). The Notice of Appearance shall include the name and address of the party to be represented and of any person who will appear as a witness, an estimate of the time to be requested for oral presentation, and, if not accompanied by a written brief, it shall include a summary statement of the party's interest in the subject matter of the hearing and of his position to be taken.

6. Submission of Written Briefs: Persons or organizations who do not desire or will be unable to be heard orally may present views, data or argument on the subject matter of the hearing by filing written briefs (in 10 legible copies) with the Authority at Ottawa prior to May 25, 1966.

7. Supplementary Statements: Within 10 days after the close of the hearing, supplementary statements or arguments may be filed (in 10 legible copies) with the Authority.

8. Hearing Transcript: A transcript of the hearing will be made for the use of the Authority. Copies of the transcript and of written briefs will be available for sale to interested parties.
