Job Evaluation Slated For March Completion

The job classification of the provincial civil service, undertaken this week by two representatives of Payne-Scott Limited, William Davidson and Jack Hoeschen, is expected to be completed in March, Mr. Davidson said yesterday.

Mr. Davidson said the project involves the determination of the job being done by every person covered by the P.E.I. Civil Service Act, and establishing the relative value of each position.

He said that extensive work will be made of some government employees in carrying out the classification plan, "the employees," he said, "will be trained to assist. This is being done for two reasons: the province will need someone to maintain the program effectively following its completion and implementation; and this is the most economical way of doing the job."

WILL HAVE OPPORTUNITY
According to Mr. Davidson, "every government employee will be given the opportunity to describe his own job, and a complete system of back-checking of all information will be established to ensure the highest level of accuracy, equity, and fairness to all."

The final report, after the job is completed in March, will show a classification of all civil service positions, and will outline procedures for its maintenance.

Provincial Secretary J. Davidson operated a milling and farming business under the name of Pound's Mills. He later moved to Vancouver where he operated a successful contracting business for some years before returning to his native province in 1910. For the past 12 years he and his wife had been living in New London in the summer and Charlottetown during the winter.

Mr. Pound was active in church and public affairs. He was secretary of the United Church Sunday School at New London, was a member of the church choir and a member of the Masonic Lodge. In addition to his wife, Janet, he is survived by two sons, Dr. H. Pound, Charlottetown and H. Aubrey Pound, Parkdale, an employee of Oglivie Foods Ltd. There are four grandchildren.
