THE SECRETARY OF THE MEETING. Lot 44, December 15, 1858. POSTSCRIPT. EXAMINER OFFICE, TUESDAY MORNING, Dec. 21.

The English Mail arrived here at a late hour last night. It reached Halifax on Thursday night last. Latest English dates are to the 4th inst.

The Nova Scotia and New Brunswick Delegates to England came passengers in the Steamer. The news from the seat of war in India is very favourable. Operations in Oude, Bengal and Central India have resulted in a series of signal defeats to the mutineers.

The Hong Kong correspondent of the Times writes:—"I hope to be able to advise you, by the next mail, of Lord Elgin having concluded, for the present, all necessary negotiations with the Chinese of the north."

SAFETY OF THE INDIAN EMPIRE.—The steamer Indian Empire, which sailed from Halifax for Galway on Oct. 31, reached Broadhaven, county Mayo, on the 26th ult., short of fuel, having encountered south-east gales within 350 miles of Galway.

The European Times says:—"That there is considerable depression at the present moment in the shipping trade cannot be doubted; but the outcry which is raised that the existence of this depression, temporary as it is in all probability will prove to be, ought to induce the British Parliament to alter the Navigation Laws, and return to the system which existed ten years ago, is too absurd to demand serious refutation."

M. de Montalembert was pardoned by the Emperor of the French from the penalties of transportation passed upon him, which pardon he has rejected in a firmly written note.

INDIA. ALEXANDRIA, Nov. 25, 1858. General Mitchell has gained a fourth victory over the rebels in Central India. He surprised them in a place called Kurral, on the 15th of October, when 3,000 were utterly dispersed, threw away their arms, and were pursued for nine miles.

Mahratta horse. He has applied to know on what terms he may surrender. The campaign in Oude opened on the 18th of October. The columns from Intehgur and Shaghanpore had advanced; the fort of Berwha, ten miles north-west of Suendell, was stormed and taken by our forces on the 21st October; our loss was about 100 killed and wounded.

A force from Saltpore defeated the rebels on the 20th October, near Moodpor, taking three guns, three elephants, and all materials. Five thousand rebels, with four guns, attacked Chubrowdie, a British station in Oude, on the 23rd of Oct.; the rebels were repulsed and pursued for six miles by our cavalry. They lost about 150 killed, and all their guns, while none were killed on our side.

On the 20th, Colonel Turner's column fell in with the fugitive rebels from Jundespore, at the village of Sakrieta, which was carried at the point of the bayonet. A man named Thomas Correr was hung at Milton, C. W., on the 30th ult., for murdering his wife. He was 63 years of age. Incendiarism to a very great extent prevails in different parts of Canada.

According to Le Canadien great misery at present prevails amidst the labouring classes of Quebec. Crowds of labourers daily surround the City Hall crying out for work.
