## CONTRACT BRIDGE

West dealer. Both sides vulnerable.

**NORTH**  
♠ K 10 6 3  
♥ J 4

The bidding:  
West North East South  
Pass Pass 1♠ 1NT

Opening lead—six of hearts. Some contracts look impossible to make, but the wily declarer does not give up on these hands without at least giving them the old college try.

For example, take this hand where South is in three notrump and West leads a heart. East takes the ace and returns a heart to the king.

Certainly declarer's outlook is dim at this point. He sees eight sure tricks, with not much prospect of getting a ninth. It would seem that his only chance of manufacturing an additional trick is to lead the ace of spades in the hope that West was dealt the singleton jack and

WASHINGTON (AP)—House of Representative Republicans decided Wednesday to send a mission to Paris for an inquiry into "the grave and imminent danger" of a split in the Atlantic Alliance.

"Are you kidding?" asked Senate Republican Leader Everett M. Dirksen when he heard of the move.

Dirksen told a press conference, "we do have a state department and we have a president who is supposed to conduct our foreign affairs."

# Negro Fails To Get Bid As Astronaut

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Pentagon announced Wednesday Capt. Edward Dwight, first and only Negro to get through U.S. air force space pilot school, was recommended for astronaut training but was not selected by the civilian Space Agency for that program.

The defence department statement said he was shelved because of "racial pressure" against him at the air force aerospace school.

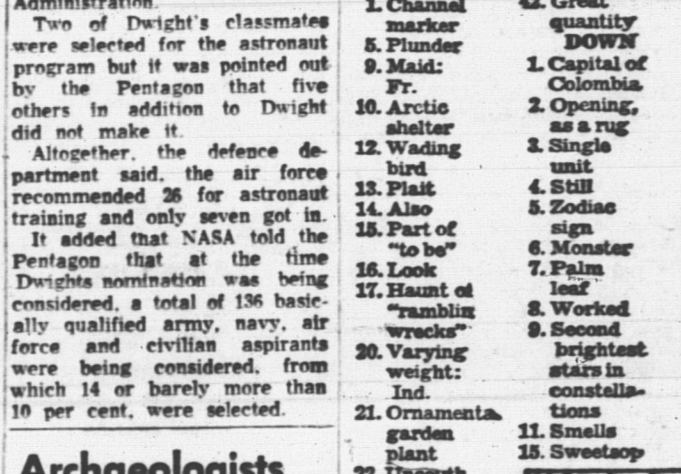
The Pentagon said the air force recommendation for further training was made without qualification and made a point of the percentage of aspirants for astronaut assistants who did not get past the selection process of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

Two of Dwight's classmates were selected for the astronaut program but it was pointed out by the Pentagon that five others in addition to Dwight did not make it.

Altogether, the defence department said, the air force recommended 26 for astronaut training and only seven got in.

It added that NASA told the Pentagon that at the time Dwight's nomination was being considered, a total of 136 basically qualified army, navy, air force and civilian aspirants were being considered, from which 14 or barely more than 10 per cent were selected.
