James I this land and the property adjoining had an interesting history. Different Lords owned this property and after a fire the Duke of Buckingham built a fine house and garden in 1674.

Today the private apartments are in the north wing overlooking Green Park while on the great west front are the State Apartments, including the White Drawing Room, the Music Room, the magnificent Blue Drawing Room and the State Drawing Room.

The long windows of all of these, as well as those of the Semi-State Rooms below, have wonderful views of the garden. Thus the garden is as important from within the Palace as from without.

St. James Park closely resembles the gardens of the Palace with its natural body of water, fine trees, simple borders and shrubs.

Set in the sweeping lawn is a curving lake which mirrors the sky and trees and enhances the feeling of space on the west side of Buckingham Palace.

Several illustrations are of the rush-fringed lake with its frame of willows and lovely trees, and the great tulip borders with a background of cherries, magnolias and lilacs planted by George the Sixth.

Next week we shall study the gardens of Windsor Castle, which rival the best of the botanical gardens in their collection of plants and in the design of the garden.
