Fire Razes House, Barn 80 Lobster Traps Lost

GEORGETOWN — Fire of an unknown origin which broke out at 11:15 a.m. Thursday morning destroyed a vacant house and large barn adjacent to it on Filroy Street, Georgetown. The property formerly owned by the late Andrew Lavers is now owned by Harry G. Lavers of Kings County.

The fire started in the barn and destroyed in the fire were 80 lobster traps, 50 of them new, and rope for 400 lobster traps owned by Ernest Jamieson. The fire is thought to have started in or near a small shed adjacent to the west end of the large barn, and in about one hour the barn and vacant house were completely destroyed.

A strong west wind was blowing at the time. The direction of the wind was all that saved the home of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph (Sonny) Johnson, situated across the street to the north of the

fire. Large junks of cinders carried by the wind ignited grass in Kent Square and adjacent to the Baptist Church on the opposite side of the town.

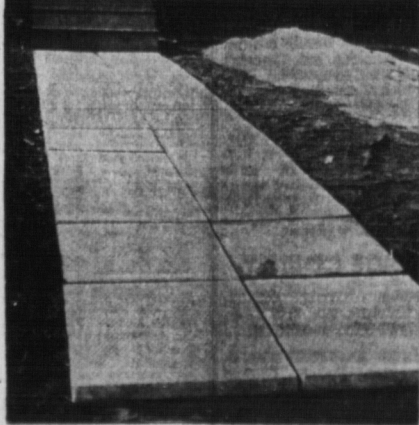
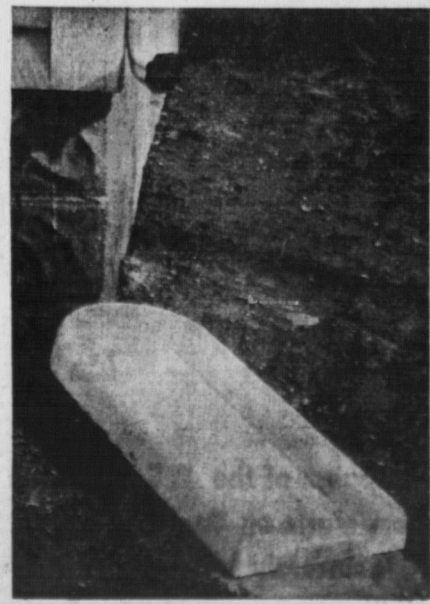
