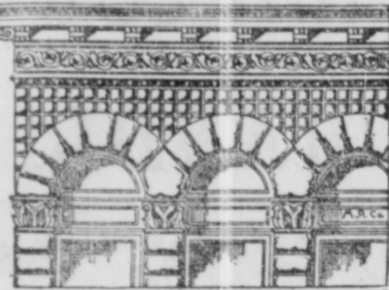

Local and Other Items.

A JEWISH SCHOOL.—The Jews of Ottawa have decided to open a school and engage a teacher to educate Jewish children in the language of their forefathers. The children will only be taught to read and write the Hebrew language. Their general education will be attended to in the public schools.

SET HERSELF ON FIRE.—Mrs Albert Bright, of the town of Fairland, Ind., attempted suicide a few days ago in an unusual manner. Deserted by the husband of a year she became insane. Entering her father's store she saturated her hair and garments with coal oil and applied a match. After this she ran into the street enveloped in flames. When overtaken and almost smothered with blankets she was unconscious and horribly burned and cannot survive.

BOTH WERE DROWNED.—At the village of Tecumseh, Ontario, one night last week, the infant daughter of Mrs George Reynolds fell into a cistern. Mrs Reynolds heard the splash and running to the cistern, jumped in to rescue her child. The water being deep and the walls of the cistern steep and slippery, Mrs Reynolds was unable to get out and an hour later the bodies of mother and child were found at the bottom of the well, locked in a death embrace.

NEW STYLE BUTTER.—The Antigonish Casket says that a few days ago, four tubs of butter, as was supposed, were purchased at the store of McCurdy & Co from a man in Pictou County. The aggregate net was 125 pounds. Upon examination it was found that the enterprising farmer had disposed of nearly a hundredweight of stones at a profitable rate of 15 cents a pound, receiving over half the price in cash. If he continues in this paying business—of which there is some doubt—he will not need to go to the K'ondike.

England's Resources in Ships.

LONDON, Oct 3. — It is known that the Government has obtained a large number of steamships. Some put the number as high as 70. England will find no difficulty in that respect, as she has the right to call upon several of the most important lines, and these are never backward in time of need. As far back as the Crimean war, Ismay, Imrie & Co. put all their ships at the disposal of the Government. If necessary all the English lines will do the same.
