



**ROOF-POUR SCHEDULED TUESDAY**

The concrete roof of the Fathers of Confederation Memorial Building in Charlottetown will be poured in three stages Tuesday. Here, Dr. Frank McKinnon, president of the Fathers of Confederation Memorial Building Foundation, examines the forms around which the concrete will be poured. The pour will be made over 286 inverted plywood boxes, each measuring five feet deep by four feet by four feet. This will give the ceiling an egg-crate effect inside. The roof has been divided into three sections and each will be poured separately. Yesterday, Dr. McKinnon conducted newspaper reporters through the building complex, bringing them up to date on construction progress.

**Deep Secrecy Was Enforced On Liner Held Up By Strike**

QUEBEC (CP)—Four young Englishmen who were aboard the Greek liner Arkadia, which remained at anchor for three days off nearby St. John's last week during the longshoremen's strike, said here that passengers didn't know the ship's destination was Halifax until long after it had left. Unable to land her 313 passengers at Quebec because of the strike, the Arkadia started down the St. Lawrence Saturday. The passengers landed at Halifax Sunday. Rodney Carpenter, 20, Peter Atkin, 17, and John Almond, 19, visiting here under the apprenticeship exchange program were aboard. "Everything was so hush-hush on the ship that we were half-way down the gulf before we were advised that our destination would be Halifax," said Carpenter. **CREATE NEW BUREAU**

TORONTO (CP) — Creation of the Queen's Printer, a government bureau independent of the National Printing Bureau, was announced Tuesday by Rene Tremblay, federal minister without portfolio. He said the function of the new body will be to control all government printed material which calls for editorial writing and is meant to carry a message either to the public or the working government staff. In Ottawa, government officials said the position of Queen's Printer will disappear under the new arrangement.

**Exporters Told To Make Study Of Apple Market**

HALIFAX (CP)—Agriculture Minister E. D. Halliburton, fresh from a two-day tour of Newfoundland, suggested here that Nova Scotia apple exporters should "get to know the people of Newfoundland better" if they expect to increase the volume of apples exported to Newfoundland. Mr. Halliburton said shipping rates from Halifax to Newfoundland are almost identical to those from Montreal to Newfoundland and that there is a friendly feeling toward the Nova Scotia product "that perhaps doesn't extend to Upper Canada." "But our exporters are carrying on the trade in the same way as 20 years ago," he said. Mr. Halliburton's visit to Newfoundland was prompted by a 25,000-bushel reduction in apple export to the province last year.

**WINTER COATS PUT ON SHEEP**

CASTLE CARROCK, England (AP) — Farmer William Wilson is putting his 3,000 sheep in sheep's clothing for the winter. The sheep are being clad in special coats of jute sacking, made to Wilson's design at 72 cents each at an Edinburgh factory. He made similar coats to protect the best sheep of his flock during last winter's severe weather and liked the results.

A Canadian Press survey from 8 p.m. local time Friday to midnight Monday showed Ontario led with 42 fatalities, 21 of them on the highways. Other provinces with traffic deaths in parentheses: Quebec 24 (16), Saskatchewan 7 (5), Manitoba 7 (4), British Columbia 7 (3), Alberta 5 (3), Nova Scotia 2 (2), New Brunswick 2 (2), Prince Edward Island 1 (2), Newfoundland 1 (1), Yukon 1 (1). Of the 100 deaths across the country, 62 were traffic, 18 drowning, 13 miscellaneous, four hunting and four in fires. The survey does not include industrial deaths, slayings or known suicides.
