Film Council Conference At S'side Yesterday

The second annual Provincial Film Council workshop conference was held yesterday at Robson's Restaurant in Summerside.

Mr. Topshee was assisted by Mr. H. B. Chandler, regional agent of the National Film Board, and director of visual education for Prince Edward Island; and by Miss Mary Christian, Mr. Jack Martin, and Mr. Stanley McInnis of the National Film Board office in Charlottetown.

Morning, afternoon, and evening sessions were held by the conference, and 46 delegates from eight film councils were registered during the day.

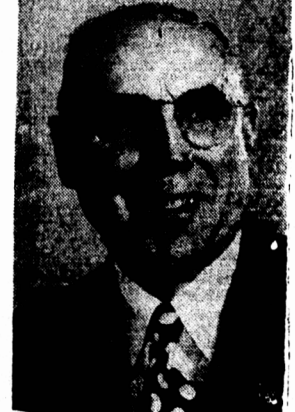
the film "The Story Of Standards", was used. This film explains what government and municipal food inspection does to ensure quality standards for the Canadian consumer.
