U. S. Steel Report. CLEVELAND, Jan. 6 - (AP) - Steel magazine reports today that for the first time in history American steel production last year totalled more than 100,000,000 tons. The estimated figure is 105,146,000 net tons, with ingot operations averaging 101 per cent of rated capacity. This compares 93,828,076 in 1950 and total world steel output in 1951 of some 228,945,000 tons. Steel says U. S. production may hit another record this year provided demands continue and metallic shortages do not become too great. Annual production capacity of the mills now is estimated at

THE WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT. Your attention is directed to the following provisions of the said Act: SECTION 66. SUB-SECTION (4). Where any work within the scope of this Part is undertaken by a contractor or contractors, the person for whom such work is undertaken shall, within seven days after the making of any such contract notify the Board in writing of the making of such contract or contracts and in such notice shall state: (a) the name and address of the contractor or contractors; (b) the nature of the work to be performed by the contractor or contractors; (c) the amount payable under the contract, whether a lump sum or in proportion to the amount of work done, and in the latter case give the full particulars; (d) the probable length of time for completion of the work to be performed by the contractor or contractors.
