CAPE. Richards was in town yesterday. RASPBERRIES are commencing to come in. Mrs. R. T. Holman, family and friends are enjoying an outing at the Island Park. Quite a large shipment of flour, etc. is to be made this morning to St. John's, by the relief committee. Mr. and Mrs. J. H. Bell, who have been making a tour of the east of the Island by horse and wagon, have returned home. The subject for the Y. M. C. A. Gospel Meeting Sunday, July 31, is "The Lord is thy keeper," Psalm 121, 5. Leader, J. B. Buchanan.

The tide of travel seems to have turned and the exodus is now greater than the arrivals, 69 going yesterday and 56 coming via the Northumberland. Mr. George Bishop received yesterday, per Miramichi, from J. Bertram & Sons, Dundas, Ont., an iron lathe which weighed 4600 pounds, for his east end foundry. The Miramichi arrived at this port yesterday from Montreal at 2 30 a. m., with 100 tourists and a small cargo of general merchandise. She sailed again at 5 for Charlotte-town.

The Inspector of Fisheries held court yesterday in the post office building, hearing cases of violation of the close laws by fishing lobsters and oysters. Several convictions were made. The teachers who looked so pleasant at Market Hall Thursday, when Mr. B. W. Jones "pressed the button," will be sorry to learn that the negatives are no good, owing to the uneven light in the hall.

The body of Miss Jane Macdonald, daughter of Duncan Macdonald, of Argyle Shore, came from Brookline, Mass., last night, where she had died of cancer. A brother of the deceased accompanied the corpse. Mr. Barlow's carding mill at Wellington was destroyed by fire Thursday afternoon. A little girl who was asleep in the building when the fire broke out had a narrow escape. Nearly all the wool was saved, but the books, etc., were burned. Loss about \$2000. No insurance. It is supposed to have caught from sparks from the grist mill.

The special meeting of the council was held on Thursday night. Thirty dollars was voted toward getting the watering cart to work, the cart being in the opinion of the chairman it is needed. Second Cook agreeing to do the work at \$2.50 per day. It was also voted that the bye-law be enforced requiring all buildings to be supplied with ladders.

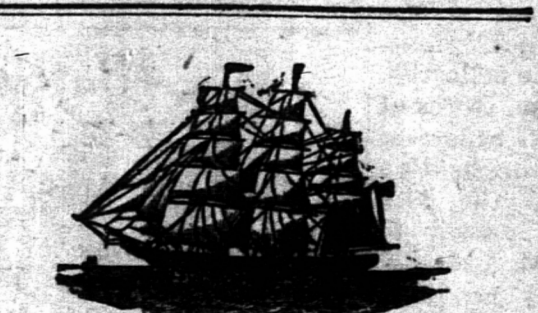
