THAT ENDLESS PIN QUESTION.

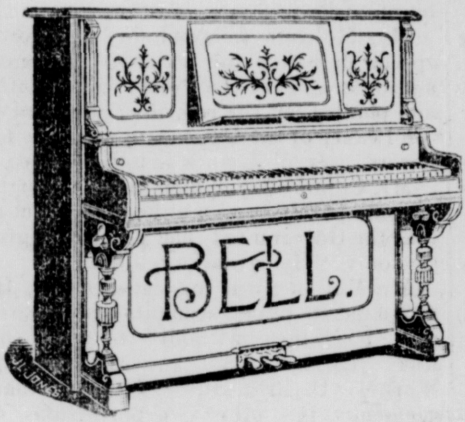
