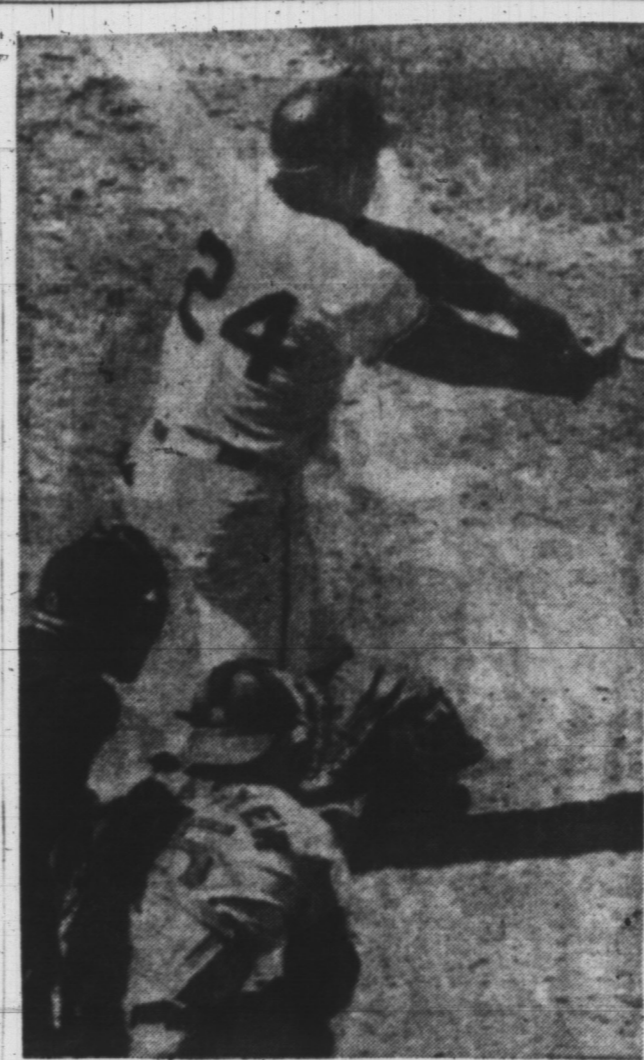

Onaway Captures Raceoff At Summerside Raceway

SUMMERSIDE A Dartmouth, N.S., entry, Onaway, captured top honors in the early closers event for non-winners of \$1,600 in 1965 here last night by capturing three dashes.

The five-year-old bay gelding, driven by Frankie Daniels, severed miles of 2:09.2, 2:08.3 and 2:08.4 in winning the feature event of the evening and in all three races led all the way.

The raceoff in the ninth dash of the night, was against Donnaway, owned by Charles Willis, O'Leary and driven by Orville Willis, and Mr. McElwyn Key, owned and driven by C. Woolridge of Coyhead.

Following the final dash of the evening Onaway was presented with a trophy by the Prince County Horsemen's club.

Going away in the raceoff Mr. McElwyn Key was against the rail, Donnaway in two, position and Onaway three on the outside. The positions reversed to

Harvey Cormier, won the third race in 2:06 35-fastest time of the night and came back in the seventh to win in 2:07 2-5.

The other double winners was Lad Oregon with times of 2:10 4-5 and 2:11 1-5. Other winners were Lace 2:06 1-5, Go Along Hal 2:07 2-5, Confederate Rose 2:16 1-5 and Jolly Tex 2:11 1-5.

Best combination pays were the daily double on Lady Oregon and Lace which returned \$179.10 and the exactor of Confederate Rose and Miss Aralac which returned \$120.40.

MONCTON, N.S. (CP) - Complete Richelieu, owned and driven by Milton Downey of Saint John, N.B., won both ends of the \$1,200 Abelard early-closer for four-year-olds on a harness racing card at Brunswick Downs here Wednesday night.

Onaway 1, Donnaway 2, and Mr. McElwyn Key, third, shortly after leaving the wire and the positions never changed throughout the race with Onaway winning by at least two lengths.

This was the 46th race for Onaway this season and the final race was his 36th victory of the year, a record not even equaled by Brent Hanover, harness racing's champion, 14 last year.

Donnaway and Mr. McElwyn Key split honors in the third and sixth race, thus forcing a three-horse raceoff. The sixth rated by most of the horsemen in attendance as the most thrilling race of the 1966 season here with six horses coming to the wire in a line. The winner, Mr. McElwyn Key, nipped the field at the wire, although he came home 6th on the outside.

Mr. McElwyn's time in this mile was the best of the night, an amazing 2:07.4. This was also a new lifetime mark for the 5-year-old bay gelding. Going in to last night's race he had a tab of 2:08.

Donnaway's time in the third dash was 2:10. Mr. McElwyn Key made a challenge in the home stretch in this trip but finished third behind Jazman and Donnaway. Donnaway had led all the way in this dash.

In the eighth dash, a single event, David P.H., a six-year-old hay horse owned by Joe K Fraser of Woodstock, N.B. and driven by Walter Craig, took a new mark of 2:09.4, thus lowering his record by a full second.

Also taking a new mark was Pine Ridge Marion in the curtain raiser. The six-year-old bay mare owned by M. E. Bernard of Kensington, did the twice around the oval in 2:12 flat in this event. Prior to this race her lifetime mark was 2:14.3.

The only double dash winner on the program other than Onaway was Sunny Key, the 11 year brown gelding owned by G. Clow of Meadowbank and driven by Junior Chappell. The gelding stepped identical miles of 2:11.
