YOUTH DAY

Tuesday, August 12th

A special feature of Old Home Week activities this year is YOUTH DAY.

The programme for the day begins at 9:30 a.m., in front of the grandstand, and includes:

9:30 - 11:00 a.m.—Talks on Cattle, Horses, Sheep, Swine and Poultry.

11:00 - 12:00 a.m.—Films: Exhibits: Forestry, Silo, Pottery, Weaving and Nutrition.

2:00 p.m.—Free Vaudeville Show.

All school children in the Province are invited to attend. The Department of Education announces that all schools taking six weeks summer vacation will not open until August 13th, so that teachers and children may have the opportunity to attend. It is desirable that school children come in groups accompanied by the teacher or some responsible person.
