Will Negotiate New Round Of Reductions In Tariffs

GENEVA, Switzerland (AP) - Members of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) agreed Saturday to negotiate a new round of worldwide tariff reductions. The negotiations are not expected to start before 1960.
The new authority of the U.S. government to reduce tariffs up to 20 per cent during a four-year period and the new joint tariff of the European Common Market will set the keynote of the negotiations.
Delegates said they thought the outlook was "promising" for a continuing steady expansion of economic development. They added that more developed countries could make an important contribution by maintaining conditions favorable to the exports of less-developed nations.
The delegates issued a communique at the end of a three-day meeting preceding GATT's 17th regular session, which began Monday and is expected to last between four and five weeks.
The communique also called for a detailed study of agricultural policies affecting the growth of international trade.
