

**Canadian PM
Non-Committal
On Nuclear Arms**

OTTAWA (CP)—Prime Minister Diefenbaker has given the United Nations Secretary-General U Thant a non-committal reply on possible Canadian acquisition of nuclear weapons. The prime minister Wednesday tabbed in the Commons a copy of his reply to U Thant's Jan. 2 letter asking Canada's views on the Swedish resolution in the UN aimed at restricting membership in the nuclear club to nations which now possess nuclear arms.

The reply says Canada has refrained from acquiring nuclear weapons "although preparatory steps have been taken to procure modern delivery systems and to train Canadian forces in their use."

"My government must, of course, continue to reserve its right to adopt such measures for the preservation of Canada's security as might be considered necessary in the light of international developments."

Mr. Diefenbaker said the government believes that only through a safeguarded international agreement, "binding on the powers which possess nuclear weapons as well as those which do not, that all countries and peoples can be assured that the further dissemination of nuclear weapons will be effectively prevented."

Union Nationale
Member Appeals**

QUEBEC (CP) — Jean-Jacques Bertrand, a prominent Quebec legislative member of the Union Nationale party, said Wednesday the approaching centenary of Confederation should be the signal for action "on behalf of a true federalism" in Canada.

It was time for the Quebec legislature to settle down to the task of "reviewing and negotiating in the name of French-Canada a new statute" with the rest of the Canadian Confederation.

Mr. Bertrand, addressing the Quebec City Richelieu Club, said the federal system in Canada must be reviewed "in the light of justified grievances of the past and the present" and Quebec must get back the financial powers essential "to the pursuit of our cultural mission."

The former Union Nationale cabinet minister, who ran unsuccessfully against Daniel Johnson last year for the party leadership, said French-Canada "firmly desires" to remain French.

"The federal system should not be blamed, however, when it might be the men running it who were at fault."

**Foundation Co.
Seeks To Block
Purchase Bid**

MONTREAL (CP) — The Foundation Company of Canada, subject of an anonymous bid for effective control last week, urged shareholders Wednesday to sign and return to the company the shareholder proxy even if they have already given a proxy to the National Trust Company, agent for the unknown bidder.

In a letter to shareholders, President L. J. McCowan said additional proxies were mailed to shareholders Wednesday to ensure the group owning 500,000 of the company's 1,138,151 outstanding shares—a 42 per cent interest—would not gain control of the company at the annual meeting late in April with less than half the outstanding shares.

Mr. McCowan, who returned immediately from a trade mission in Australia to fight the bid for effective control of the company, claimed the offerer has not agreed to return the proxies of shares tendered to the National Trust but not bought.

He said these shares will not be represented in the voting, and, with some votes immobilized, the bidder could gain control of the company.

The bid, announced Tuesday, March 13, said the first 500,000 shares tendered the National Trust would be bought at \$14.75 a share.

**Ore Pipeline
Now Planned**

TORONTO (CP) — Northgate Explorations Ltd., Canadian mining company, says it plans to transport lead, silver, copper and zinc concentrates by pipeline from the property at Tynagh in Ireland's Galway County Galway Bay.

The company is currently conducting surveys to establish the best possible route for the pipeline, which would be about 30 miles long, to transport the ore concentrates in a treatment plant and harbor at Galway Bay.

The survey will also include the Galway Bay area, with a view to establishing sites for possible docks, power plant, treatment plant and disposal areas.

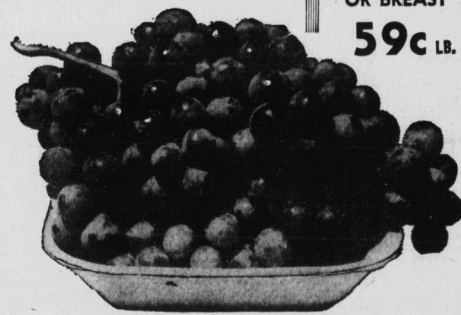
