

Shakespeare Film Series

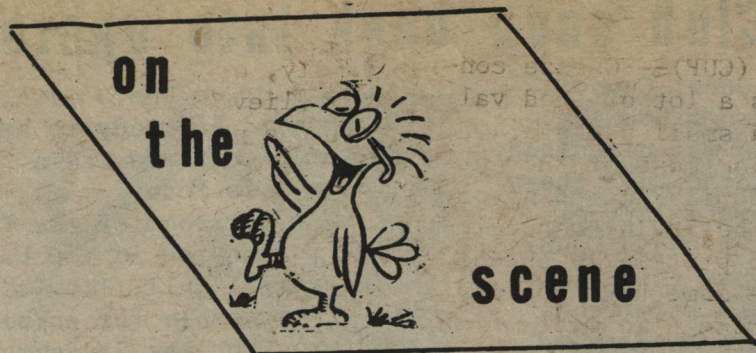
