My MAGIC pastry rates cheers! MAGIC CHICKEN TURNOVERS Combine and chill 1 1/2 c. finely-diced cooked chicken, 1/2 c. medium-thick white sauce. Mix and sift into bowl, 2 c. once-sifted pastry flour (or 1 1/2 c. once-sifted hard-wheat flour), 3 tsp. Magic Baking Powder, 1/2 tsp. salt, 1 lb. granulated sugar. Cut in finely, 3 lbs. shortening. Mix 1 beaten egg and 1/4 c. milk. Make a well in dry ingredients, pour in liquid and mix lightly with a fork. Roll dough out to 1/4" thickness; cut into 4" squares. Place about 2 lbs. chicken mixture on each square, near corner. Fold dough over diagonally, making triangles. Seal edges by pressing with fork tines; prick tops. Bake on greased pan in hot oven, 450°, 15 min. or until golden brown.
