## Plans For New High School In City By Sept. Outlined

Need for provision of a new high school by September of next year was foreseen by Dr. Gordon Lea, chairman of the City School Board, as he outlined the board's plans for the future to City Council at a joint meeting last night at City Hall.

The new school, mooted here ever since it became known the provincial government was giving serious consideration to making Prince of Wales College a degree-granting university, would be designed for pupils in grades 10, 11 and 12.

Dr. Lea said the proposed school, costing in the vicinity of \$850,000, would be planned for an estimated 750 pupils. The site of the building would be the area just north of Queen Charlotte High School in which the school board has several acres on option. It would be a fully integrated school without regard to religious views.

TRACES DEVELOPMENT For the benefit of newer members of city council he traced the development of the present plans and pointed out that city taxpayers until 1964 would be paying for schools which should have been built or planned for over the previous 50 years. (Dr. K. A. Parker, superintendent of city schools, later remarked on "the crass and gross negligence" over this same period.)

The reference was to the fact that from 1878 until 1952 no new schools were built in the city and as Dr. Lea stated "worse still no provision was made for a building fund".

The two important civic bodies met in joint session for the first time in many years at the request of Mayor Walter Cox who told the gathering each body should know the plans and problems of the other to provide better understanding between them.
