Midsummer Examinations.

WEST KENT STREET SCHOOL.

To-day was the happy day for this school. Among the visitors who were present at the examination and closing exercises were His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor and Mrs Macdonald, Hon David Laird, Mr L H Davies, M P, D Montgomery, Esq, Superintendent of Education, Prof Anderson, Dr Taylor, Thos Handrahan, R R Fitzgerald, F L Hassard, A B Warburton, T C James, T A McLean, Alex. McKinnon, H J Palmer, F H Beer, John Ings and Donald Farquharson, besides many other ladies and gentlemen.

There were enrolled in this school last year 448 pupils, taught by eight teachers. The daily average attendance was 335, and the percentage of attendance, 81.

The reports of those who took part in the examination were very favorable. Though the attendance was thin—owing to special causes—it was evident that the school continues to do good solid educational work. A reading contest between boys drawn from the two highest classes, for Mr L H Davies' prize, was the most interesting feature of the examination. It resulted in the success of Wellington Nelson and John S Lewis, who were declared equal.

The entertainment was very pleasing—through the extreme reticence of the boys when singing the opening chorus was very marked. It is a pity that boys who are loud enough at other times should remain silent when an opportunity offers to use their voices with good effect.

At the close, short addresses were delivered by the Lieutenant-Governor, Mr L H Davies, Dr Anderson and Mr Montgomery.

Thomas Handrahan, Esq., presided at the entertainment, and the prizes were distributed by the Lieutenant Governor.
