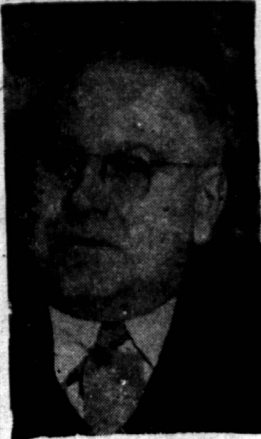


# Mayor Of Georgetown Dies Following A Brief Illness

The citizens of Georgetown were shocked and saddened when it was learned of the sudden death of their Mayor and Chief Magistrate, Percy Lewis Boudreault in his 81st year, whose death occurred at the Charlottetown Hospital yesterday afternoon. Mayor Boudreault was stricken at his home on Saturday, June 1st, and was removed by ambulance in the early hours of yesterday morning.

The deceased was born in Georgetown, the son of the late Peter Boudreault and Sophia King. He received his education at Georgetown High School and was active in his school days and church activities.

In 1931 he joined the Provincial Police Force and when the Royal Canadian Mounted Police came to the Province he was taken on as a member of that force, and for a number of years he was in charge of the Georgetown detachment.

Following his retirement from the R.C.M.P. in the mid 1930's he went into business as a general merchant with his home and business establishment located on the corners of Kent and Richmond Streets. During the Second World War he began his first term as Mayor of Georgetown, and at the time of his sudden passing he was serving this capital town of King's County for his seventh term as Mayor. During his many years in this office many changes and improvements came about in which he was directly involved and for many of which he was mainly responsible. Georgetown's fine new rink and recreation centre was built during one of his terms of office. It was a community effort but it may be said that the leadership, zeal and executive ability of Mayor Boudreault made a task, which many times appeared impossible, eventually become a reality.

Town Councils under his leadership were able to maintain and improve such vital civic necessities as public buildings, streets, and sidewalks, and his co-operation with government departments resulted in the obtaining for the town of numerous and invaluable services and improvements. For a number of years he found time to serve on the Town's Board of School Trustees.

He was president of the Holy Name society and a trustee of St. James' Roman Catholic Church and for the past 40 years he served as choir master and organist of St. James Church.
