Opening lead—seven of clubs. It takes no great amount of skill to make a contract that is destined to make regardless of how the opponents' cards are divided.

The real test comes when declarer is faced with a situation where he seems fated to go down because the opposing cards are badly stacked against him. Making a contract under these conditions is what really tests a declarer's skill.

Let's say that South ruffs the club lead, plays a heart to the ace, cashes the ace of diamonds, ruffs a club, and then takes a diamond finesse.

Largest Heavy Water Plant Will Be Built At Sask. Site

REGINA (CP)—A \$46,000,000 heavy water plant—the world's largest—will be built at Estevan in southern Saskatchewan, it was announced here by Premier Ross Thatcher.

He made the announcement at a press conference here, timed to coincide with the same announcement being made in the House of Commons by federal Industry Minister C. M. Drury.

The announcement said the federal government had accepted the recommendation of the Atomic Energy Commission of Canada to accept the bid of Western Deuterium Company Limited of Victoria for the sale of heavy water to be produced at the plant.

The production of heavy water is essential for the production of nuclear power.

Small Town's Liquor Sales Were Booming For 76 Days

HAWKESBURY, Ont. (CP)—It's easy now to do business in Hawkesbury.

There's no trouble finding a place to park. Restaurants are not crowded and there's no waiting for service.

It doesn't take much time even to go to that white-topped store on the corner, place an order and walk away with a package wrapped in brown paper.

It wasn't always that way. Two weeks ago you would

have been lucky to find a vacant metre. Or a table in a restaurant. Or a place at the counter in that white-topped store.

Those were the days, 76 of them, when automobiles with Quebec licence plates descended on Hawkesbury in droves, forced to make the journey by the now-settled liquor strike back home. Business boomed.

And all because of that white-topped store. That Ontario Liquor Control Board outlet.

COUNT PROFITS

The 9,100 residents of this provincial border community are still counting the profits from the nine-week honeymoon which ended last Friday when Quebec Liquor Board stores reopened and Montrealers didn't have to look to Hawkesbury any longer for a bottle of liquor.

The white-topped store says it took in \$1,352,000 during those 76 days.

"We were going crazy," said one of the store employees. "We've had people buy a few hundred dollars worth in the past, but lately a few hundred dollars has been peanuts."

"It was good for everyone," said a jewelry store owner across the street. "While the men lined up to buy their liquor, the women were going around the stores."

But it's all over now.

MP Is Angry Over CPR Plan To Drop Trains

OTTAWA (CP)—An angry Liberal MP declared that Parliament has a duty to stop the CPR from carrying out its stated intention of abandoning passenger services.

Gerald A. Regan, member for Halifax, said CPR executives must not be allowed to operate like "the pirates who sometimes picture themselves to be."

Drawing bursts of desk-thumping applause from the Liberal and NDP benches, he said those who run the CPR have been going about the country speaking "openly and blatantly" of a plot to get rid of passenger trains.

Transport Minister Pickersgill said it was not his duty to defend the CPR but he quoted an article from the Winnipeg Free Press in which an official of the railway denied rumors that the trans-continental Dominion passenger train was to be dropped.

The article said mail and express were being switched from the Dominion to fast freights with the aim of improving passenger schedules.

NEED MORE

Making a similar announcement in the House of Commons, Industry Minister Drury said production of Canada's first heavy-water plant, now being built in Cape Breton, will be insufficient to meet domestic demand.

Mr. Drury said Western Deuterium had promised to use Canadian equipment and engineering talent and to employ Canadian workers at the new plant.

The new plant at Estevan will use a more advanced process than the hydrosulphide process to be employed at the Cape Breton plant, he added.

The Estevan plant will employ about 500 men during construction and about 200 men when it goes into production. It will use more than 1,000 tons of lignite coal daily from the fields near Estevan.

In his announcement to the House of Commons, Mr. Drury said construction of the 300-ton-a-year plant at Glace Bay is progressing on schedule.

Construction of the plant is expected to start early this summer. Exact site has not been designated, but it will be near Estevan.

Heavy water will be produced under a five-year contract with the Atomic Energy Commission for a purchase price of \$14.65 a pound. Assurance has been given by the federal government that a further five-year contract will follow.

Heavy water is used in Canadian-designed nuclear electric power stations to make the atomic fission process possible with the atomic reactor. It is further used to remove heat from the reactor to turn ordinary water into steam to drive electric power turbo-generators.

As was the case with the first plant in Nova Scotia, certain financial commitments had to be made by the provincial government.

The operating company will be responsible for plant construction, maintenance and utilization.
