Track Program Is Concluded

Montague's Conahan brothers dominated the track and field competitions held in connection with the Dundas Plowing Match. Young John Conahan made a clean sweep of the junior events in yesterday's competition to rack-up 20 points and nail down the honors as top male athlete for the two day track and field program. In Wednesday's senior competition John's big brother, Billy, topped the senior men's division with a total of 16 points.

A third brother of the two already mentioned (Wally) also turned in some fine performances at the Dundas competition and was in contention for the top male athlete award right down till the last few events were completed. The Conahan brother's train under Bob Herring who is the newly appointed physical education instructor at Montague Regional High School. Bob is very enthusiastic about his work and his efforts were evident with the fine performance turned in by Montague athletes at this meet.

The performance of young John MacLeod from Charlottetown was one of the highlights of yesterday's action in the opinion of this observer. MacLeod a young blond headed youngster who is (we believe) just 13-years-old. He held his own extremely well against opponents which were two and three years older and quite a bit bigger than himself. Young MacLeod placed first in the 100 and 220 yard running events as well as taking top honors in the standing and running broad jumps. The game little competitor lost ground in the high jump, shot put, 440 and 800 yard runs.

The results of the tug-of-war competition staged in conjunction with the sporting events were not available when this column went to press Wednesday night. We learned yesterday that Red Point lightweights defeated St. Peter's Bay in the longest pull of the match which lasted over four minutes to win the championship.

An Interesting Event

One of the most interesting and we might say highly competitive events on yesterday's program was an event which we must confess we have never seen on a track and field program before. What was it? The final event of the day was a rolling-pin throwing contest, open to any females wishing to enter. Doris Young proved to be without a match in this event as she heaved the rolling-pin 64 feet. Mrs. James Bennett took second place honors while Mrs. Russell Bailey picked up the third place ribbon. Charlottetown's Heather MacLean was the top female athlete for the meet with a total of 16 points. Female entries were small in the track and field events and three Charlottetown girls: Heather MacLean, Rhoda MacLeod and Francis Whitlock were the only three competitors in serious contention for the top female athlete award.

Rhoda MacLeod is one of the best running broad jumpers (female) that we have seen in some time on the Island track scene and it just happens that she is an older sister of John MacLeod who turned in such a fine performance in yesterday's action. The meet was under the direction of the provincial physical fitness association in co-operation with directors of the annual Plowing Match fair.

Allan Andrews and George MacMillan carried out the officiating duties for the two day meet. Both these boys are well known on the local hockey scene and they will be leaving the Island Tuesday to attend classes at the University of New Brunswick. MacMillan performed with the Maritime champion St. Dunstan's Varsity team while Andrews toiled with the Borden Nationals in the Prince County loop.

HUNTER'S CORNER

Duck And Goose Limits To Remain The Same

The opening dates of the duck and goose season have been announced for 1965 with no change from last year. Six ducks per day with a possession limit of 12, all black ducks if one wishes to specialize on blacks. It doesn't greatly matter with respect to kill for we haven't the ducks to kill when it comes to the highly prized black duck. We have an approximate nine thousand waterfowl hunters in the province, according to the latest census, and this column will place the number of local black ducks in the province this season and that figures out at one half duck (black) per hunter.

There has been some caustic comment over the season on waterfowl being extended to December 15th. I said to one chap: "Why worry chum?" They could extend the duck season to January 31st and raise the daily limit on black ducks to 12 per day and it would be nothing but a senseless gesture for we have not got the ducks to hunt or shoot." He laughed and replied: "I never thought of it in that way!" Last season there was a quite a squawk over the snipe season being open before ducks were legal game. I wonder what the boys will have to holler about this season.

I note that two Biologists have been appointed to work in the province with specific emphasis on the study of trout habitat being created. Such habitat will be handy for potato growers to wash their sprayers in. I was told on August 31st about a spot bordering North River which was its on the opposite side of the Causeway and Charlotteville. Apparently it is being used as a dump for house spray cans, discarded heavy paper bags that formerly held spray material. Some of the bags and cans are in the water and more of such material on the verge of being blown into the water. Some of our politicians express a desire to improve our trout fishing facilities as a tourist attraction but don't interfere with potato growers notwithstanding the fact that trout and top killer don't mix. I remember back in the days when I was active as a game warden. I prosecuted four sawmill operators for allowing sawdust to enter water frequented by trout and a starch factory operator for allowing a deleterious substance to enter water frequented by trout. The then Premier and Attorney General in office at the time ruled that "Sport must not be allowed to interfere with industry." Incidentally I have been informed that the R.C.M.P. Police have established the identity of the potato grower who was responsible for the whole mess at the Millard's Dam and Souris River recently. Our team of Biolo-
