JOSEPH WILLIAM NOONAN

The Angel of Death visited the home of Mrs. William Noonan, 38 Rhode Island Avenue, Somerville, Mass., on February 5, and called her devoted husband Bill Noonan to his reward.

Mr. Noonan had been ill for some time and was lovingly cared for in his home by his devoted wife Frances.

He was a faithful parishioner of St. Benedict's Church, Somerville, and a loyal member of the Holy Name Society. He was visited bi-weekly by the Rev. Lawrence J. Doyle, who also administered the last rites of the Catholic Church. During his illness he was also visited by the Rev. John Hogan and Rev. Paul J. Moriarty.

Mr. Noonan was an employee of the Boston Rubber Hose Co., Cambridge, Mass., and was held in high esteem. He was noted for dry humor, a fine sense of justice, and generous hospitality.

He left Palmer Road, P. E. I., in 1925, for Detroit, Michigan, where he remained until 1930. He came to Boston, and resided there since. In 1941 he was married to Frances McPhee.

The deceased was waked at his home, where friends and relatives came to pay their respects. Among these was Rev. Brother Arator, F. S. C., of Albany, New York, a brother-in-law, who daily led the recitation of the rosary. A large congregation accompanied the remains to the cemetery where Bill was laid to rest beside his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Richard Noonan, who predeceased him 30 years ago.
