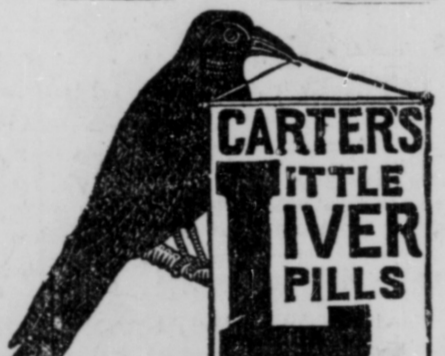

A Christmas Pie.

It is supposed a very great curiosity was made by Mrs Dorothy Patterson, housekeeper at Howick. It was near 9 feet in circumference at bottom, weighs about 12 stones, will take two men to present it to table; it is neatly fitted with a case and four small wheels to facilitate its use to every guest that inclines to partake of its contents at table."

Christmas in Russia.

The Russian Christmas is ten days later than the English one, but is celebrated very much in English fashion. Families all meet upon that day and country house parties are many. The tree is a Christmas yew and is beautifully decorated. The gifts are placed on small tables near the tree. The churches are decorated with greens and so are the houses, but no mistletoe is used.

Two or three days are public holidays at Christmas time, and the people greet each other with, "Happy feast to you."

A huge pyramid of rice with raisins in it, which has been blessed at the church, is served at the Christmas dinner, and the meats are goose, duck and sucking pig. A great delicacy at a Russian Christmas dinner is veal which has been fed entirely upon milk for that special day.

A Cemetery For Old Clothes.

In the north of London there is a little plot of ground where old clothes are buried and afterward exhumed for a curious purpose. It is a flat, barren and desolate piece of ground and presents a very melancholy spectacle.

Little wooden stumps, bearing numbers, mark the graves.

There is a paper mill near by, which finds it rather difficult to get suitable material for the manufacture of a special paper.

The ordinary old rags are no good. The rags themselves have to be manufactured. Old coats, old trousers and old dresses are covered with wet soil, and after a few weeks' rotting are exhumed.

A corner is set aside for old linen goods. The linen is placed in layers in a box, with soft rich soil between each layer, and then buried.

Limewater is then sprinkled over the grave, and after a fortnight's rotting the linen is reduced to a mere skeleton, which is taken out of the box, laid flat in a warm blanket and rushed off to the paper mill.

Though it is only the size of a football ground, it contains 2,000 graves, which are marked by 2,000 wooden stumps, each bearing a number.

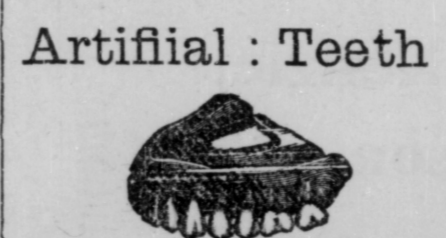
