DISARMAMENT OF THE MUSSULMANS.

Turks are Reluctant to Comply.

BRITISH ADMIRAL INSISTS ON THEIR OBEYING.

And the Disarmament Has Already Been Begun.

CANDIA, Sept. 20.—The disarmament of Mussulmans has been delayed. Sjedevan Pasha, the Turkish military commander demanding that the arms be delivered on board a Turkish warship.

Admiral Noel, the British naval commander, insists that they be handed to a British guard.

Ethem Pasha, the Turkish governor, has just had a proclamation published and read saying that by order of the Sultan all arms must be surrendered to the committee formed for that purpose.

The surrender has already begun. There is no disturbance.

ATTEMPT TO KILL AGUINALDO

Made by a Spanish Prisoner.

TRIED TO ADMINISTER POISON TO HIM.

Friars Said to be Implicated—Thanksgiving Services Held.

MANILA, Sept. 20.—The Republica Filipina asserts that an attempt was made upon the person of Aguinaldo.

A steward it is added saw a Spanish prisoner who had been allowed his freedom make a movement which appeared like tampering with a bowl of soup intended for Aguinaldo.

The steward tasted a teaspoonful of the soup and died.

Eleven Franciscan friars are said to have been in the conspiracy.

The populace, it is further said, attempted to lynch all the Spanish prisoners, but Aguinaldo intervened.

During the evening special thanksgiving services were held in the churches at Malolos for his escape.

NOTES AND COMMENTS.

—Mr. F. C. Wade, the registrar of the Yukon, says the officials sent up by the Government were given special permission to stake gold claims for themselves. For the dissatisfaction their acts under this permission may have caused, therefore, the Government is responsible.

—More than 20,000,000 acres of land in the United States is owned by the aristocracy of England. This is a startling statement to make; but it is nevertheless true. These millions of acres of the finest land in this country are controlled, ruled and managed absolutely by the English nobility as if they were located in the British Isles. The peers and peeresses of Great Britain do not confine their landed estates to the realm of the Union Jack, but they have reached out their hands and appropriated these many millions of acres beneath the Stars and Stripes.

—The Liberal method of cutting down expenditure is described as follows by the Montreal Star. "The financial statement for the last fiscal year shows that the Government collected over forty millions from the people and spent over forty-four millions. This is being represented to us by the Liberal press as a great achievement. It certainly is, in the way of repudiated pledges, and a cheerful abandonment of cherished principles. This Liberal Government, when it came in, was to lighten the taxation on the people and to put a stop to these wicked Tory increases in the national expenditure. The above figures show the largest revenue on record and the greatest total expenditure since the old C. P. R. days."

CUBA IN A TERRIBLE STATE.

The Island Drifting Towards Anarchy.

ARMED BANDS PROWLING AROUND, ROBBING.

People Have to Steal to Keep Themselves Alive.

LONDON, Sept. 20.—The Times Havana correspondent says the island is fast drifting into a condition of anarchy.

Insurgent bands are enjoying immunity in the commission, outrages and plundering.

The insurgents of the western provinces complain bitterly of having been ground down and abandoned by the United States and being left utterly destitute and can only save themselves from starvation by rapine.

SUICIDE'S WONDERFUL NERVE.

Took Poison and Kept a Dairy of His Sufferings.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Sept. 17.—The body of Faed Langsdorf, aged 46, a bookbinder and spiritualist, has been found on the bank of Kaw, at a point near Armourdale, Kansas. He had committed suicide after taking a drachm of morphia and a drachm of prussic acid, in small quantities covering a period of four days, then opening the veins of his arm. Langsdorf's suicide was a most wonderful show of nerve and determination. An ante mortem statement of the suicide, found in a little note book beside the body, told how he had on Wednesday, September 7, between two and three in the afternoon taken several grains of morphia and sat down under a tree to await death. In the note book is given a minute account of his feelings after swallowing the drug, and his happiness at being so near the "other side," which he calmly dilates upon. Thursday a notation tells of the suicide's regret and wonder at the poison not having taken effect, and of the increased dose which he has taken. A line or two on Friday shows his regret at his inability to kill himself and of more poison taken. On Saturday he has, he says, taken 30 grains of morphia and 60 grains of prussic acid, and this amount of poison having failed to do its work, he will open a vein of his arm with a book-binder's cutting tool which he had. There the writing ended. When Langsdorf's body was found, everything indicated that he had gone through what his ghastly diary related.
