CONTRACT BRIDGE

North dealer. Both sides vulnerable. ♠ K Q J 8 3, ♥ A 7 4, ♦ 9 8, ♣ 9 6 4. ♠ 10 7 4, ♥ 9 5 3, ♦ K 7 5 2, ♣ A J 10 8. ♠ A 6 5 2, ♥ K Q J 10 8 2, ♦ J 6, ♣ J 5. The bidding: North East South West 1 ♠ Pass 1 ♥ Pass 2 ♠ Pass 4 ♥ Pass. Opening lead—king of spades. The jump bid to four hearts in this sequence, aside from showing adequate strength to warrant a game bid, is also used to impress partner with the fact that the heart suit is self-sufficient. It can be seen that North might be his own suits if South's approach had been less forceful. South won the spade lead, and trumped a spade in dummy. A low club was led from dummy, and East went up with the ace. On the spade return West took his two spade tricks, which resulted in a one trick set. Aside from the possibility the defense might slip and let him get away with the singleton ♣.
