Post Office To Accept Deposits

ST. JOHN'S, FID., June 28. (CP-News) The post office will have a post office savings bank as soon as officials of the posts and telegraphs department can get it working. The plan, under consideration for a year, was approved by the Commission of Government. Interest at three per cent will be paid on deposits up to \$5,000. On amounts exceeding \$5,000 the interest will be 2 1/2 per cent. Interest on corporation accounts will be at the rate of 1 1/2 per cent. About 50 post offices have been selected to accept deposits. As soon as supervisors of the department have acquainted postmasters with details of the plan it will be put into effect. Deposits from \$1 up will be accepted. Anyone more than 10 years of age may open an account. Trusts for children under that age may be opened.

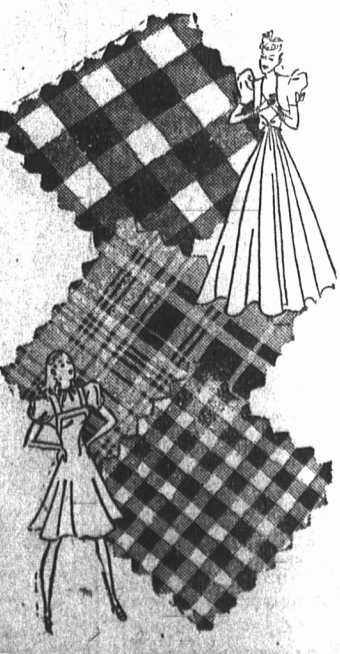
