A By-Law to Encourage New Industries in the City of Charlottetown. BE it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:

1. All applications for exemption of new industries from taxation shall be made by petition to the Mayor and Council, such petition to be signed by the person, company or corporation presenting the same, and to contain full particulars of the new industry sought to be exempted, the amount of capital proposed to be invested therein, and the amount to be paid yearly for wages, and the tax or taxes from which exemption is sought.
