On the 4th day of the experiment, Breen was given a clock.

"The effect has been to bring more stability to the periods of being awake and asleep," the report said.

Each one of the tasks on his simulated space flight, Breen has had to push a button a certain number of times to obtain cigarettes.

Initially he received one cigarette for every 30 minutes. At that time he was smoking about 40 cigarettes each 24 hours.

The experimenters agreed the work requirement to 500 presses for each cigarette, and Breen's consumption dropped to 10 in a 24-hour period.

"Although the subject continued to perform satisfactorily, he became so irritable that it was necessary to change again to a flexible scale," the report said.

"His greatest objection to the large amount of time he had to spend at the push-button control was his feeling that it was a waste of time and that he was wasting his money and that he was being punished by the experimenters," the report said.
