Miss Dorothy Simmonds and Miss Pauline Diamond of Charlottetown were guests at the home of Mrs. N. W. Hansen for several days recently.

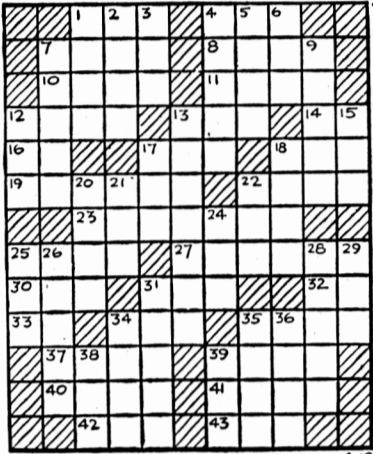
Mr. Frank Creamer and son of Charlottetown were guests on Sunday, April 13th of Mr. and Mrs. Guy Hemphill.

Explains Compensation Benefits To Fishermen

The quarterly meeting of the P. E. Island Fisheries Federation was held yesterday, following a luncheon at the Queen Hotel at one o'clock. The meeting was presided over by the President, Mr. Lorne Noonan, who expressed his appreciation to those who were in attendance, some at a considerable disadvantage, due to travel conditions and business commitments.

The minutes of the last quarterly meeting were read by the Secretary, Mr. Walthen Gaudet, and approved. Brigadier Reid, chairman of the Compensation Board, on invitation from the Federation, gave a thorough and comprehensive account of the work of the Board, and its relations to both the fishery industries and the employees, and the situation governing accidents and other incidents resulting in medical or surgical attention, as well as the compensation paid to those who lose time through such accidents, and the relative cost to the employers.

In the business under review, that is fishing, the Board deals with 47 firms employing approximately 1200 persons. Under the latest regulations, brought forward at the recent session of the Legislature, an injured worker is compensated to the extent of 75 per cent of wages. In addition to full hospitalization, which is arranged for in every respect, by the Board, including doctor, X-ray, operating and medicine. The employer is freed absolutely from all responsibility.

Brigadier Reid pointed out the advantages accruing to the family involved, when all these necessary items are withdrawn from the regular functions of the home, where sickness due to accident would otherwise make inroads on time and the home budget. He
