Applicants must be a member of the Roman Catholic Church and a resident of PEI. Deadline: September 15. Connolly Estate Bursaries

These bursaries are for Roman Catholic males from PEI.

Tenable for the first or second year at a recognized university. Deadline: August 1.

## St. Andrew's Bursary

These bursaries are available to Roman Catholic students who are at least 50% of Scottish origin.

They are tenable for three years of college or university. Deadline: August 15.

As you can tell, the mentioned scholarships are for Roman Catholic students only. There are many sources of financial aid which do not specify religion as a condition of eligibility.

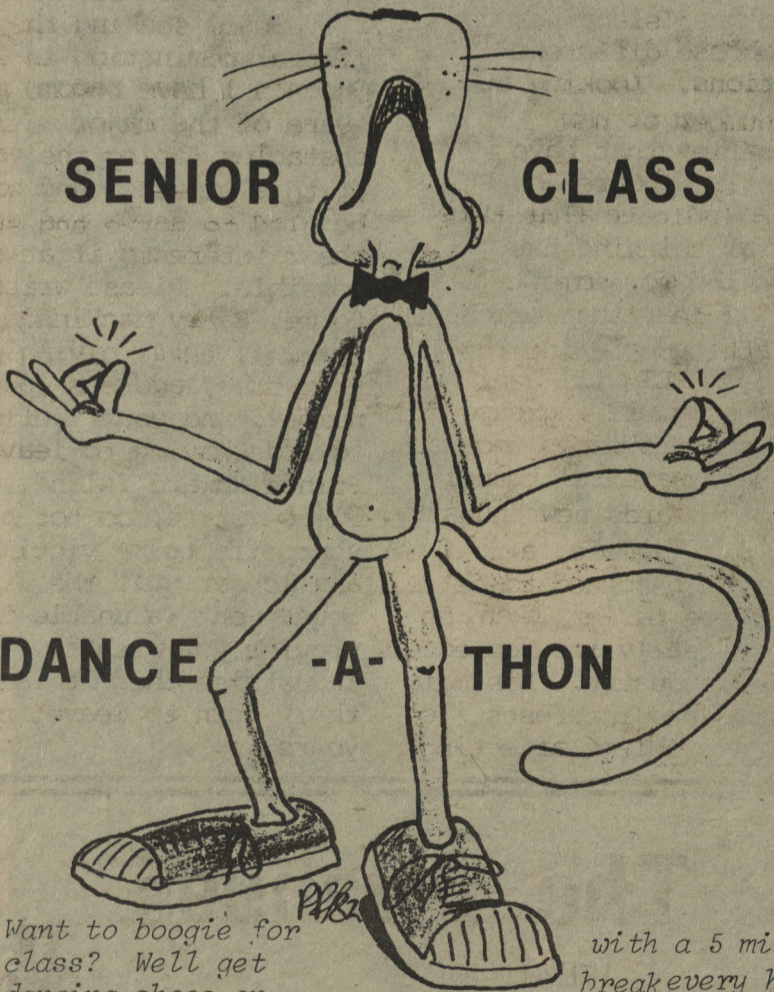
