CONTRACT BRIDGE By B. Jay Becker

(Top Record-Holder in Masters' Individual Championship Play)

South dealer. Neither side vulnerable.

NORTH
♠ A Q 10 9
♥ 7 4 3
♦ K 10 4
♣ K 5 2

WEST
♠ J 8 5
♥ 8 5
♦ J 9 2
♣ J 10 8 7

EAST
♠ K 6 4
♥ Q 10 9 2
♦ 7 3

SOUTH
♠ 7 5 3

The bidding:
South West North East
1 ♠ Pass 1 ♠ Pass
1 NT Pass 3 NT

Opening lead—seven of clubs.
South's one notrump rebid, holding two little clubs, was of doubtful character. A two diamond rebid, which is also a slow-down bid, is preferable, despite the rather weak texture of the diamond suit. The signoff bid of one notrump should be avoided with a weak doubleton in an unbid suit.

Dealer played low from dummy on the club lead, East winning with the jack. A heart return was taken with the ace and a spade to the nine brought forth East's king. South then won another heart return and cashed his spades and diamonds to make four notrump.

The hand could have been dealt in a different way. If the three of clubs had been dealt to North instead of South, the hand would have been a different matter. In fact, it is the only correct play. The basis for it is our old friend, the Rule of Eleven.

There are four cards higher than the seven lead (7 from 11) in the three hands outside of West's. East sees three of them in his own hand and one in dummy. Therefore, if West led his fourth best club, South cannot beat the seven.

By ducking the seven, West is able to continue the suit and cash four immediate club tricks. Eventually, declarer has to concede the king of spades for the setting trick.

The contract cannot be defeated if the bidding progresses so that North becomes declarer. A club lead from East hands declarer his ninth trick, while a heart lead gives North ten tricks by developing the spades in the same way we have already seen.

The recommended sequence of bids, which will result in placing the play of the hand with North is:

SOUTH **NORTH**
1 ♠ 1 ♠
2 ♣ 2 ♣
3 NT 3 NT

From South's view, after North bids three diamonds, game at notrump becomes likely provided North has a club stopper. Hence the three heart bid.

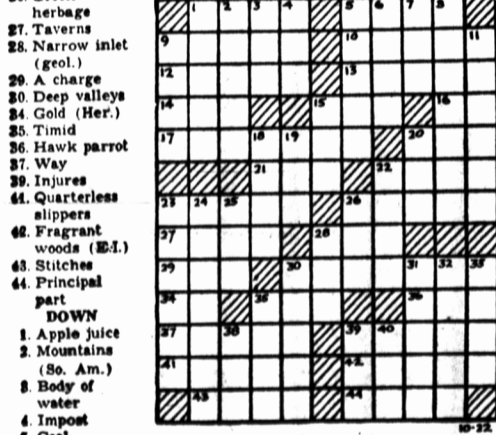
