Marketing pattern for beef changes

OTTAWA -- There was a 13 per cent increase in cattle slaughtered in federally inspected plants last year, according to CDA's Markets Information Section.

And there was a change in the pattern of marketings, notes Ralph Bennett, director of CDA's Livestock Division.

The number of Choice and Good combined marketed last year increased by 33,259 to 1,348,871 carcasses. But percentage-wise, Choice and Good were down from 54.3 in 1964 to 49.3.

The pattern in slaughtering were:

- no increase in steers
- a moderate increase in heifers
- a sharp increase in cows.

The drought in Eastern Canada which caused a cut-back the number of animals that would normally be wintered over.

Culling of western herds because the ranges were overstocked and the price for slaughter cows was attractive.

Bennett adds that all the product from low grade cows, known in the trade as canners and cutters, moved at favorable prices too because of the gradually developing world-

Veterinarian in new post

OTTAWA -- Dr. Lesley H. Ferris, 33, has been appointed assistant director of the Contagious Diseases Division, CDA Health of Animals Branch at Ottawa.

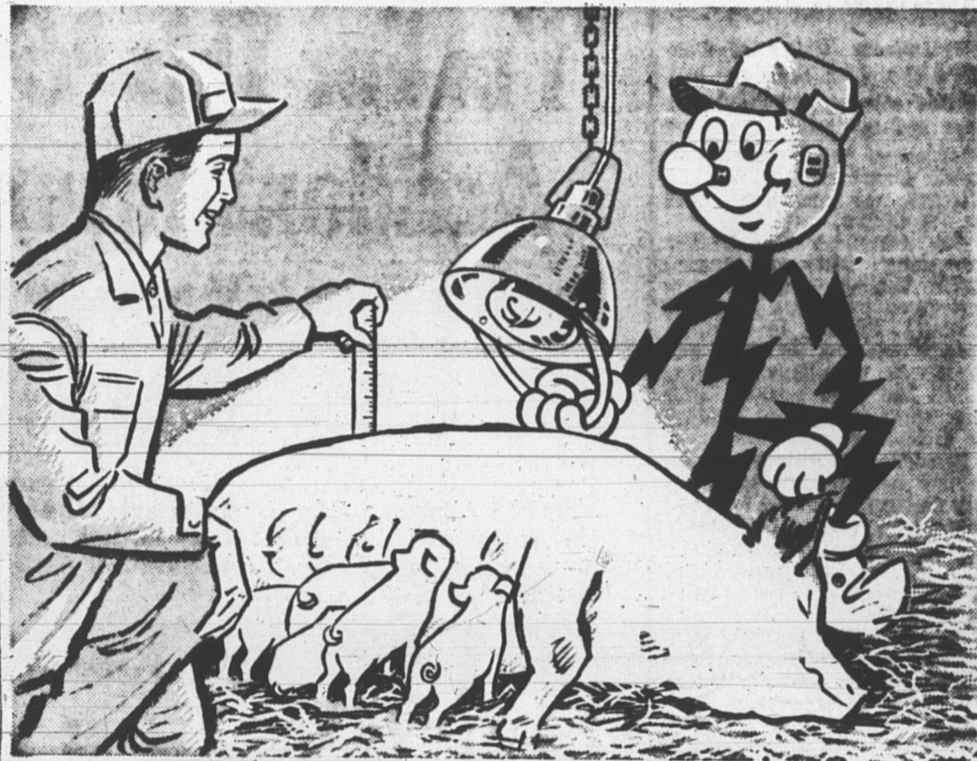
Dr. Ferris, formerly assistant district veterinarian at Toronto, takes over the post held by Dr. Harold Reeker, now district veterinarian for the Branch in Saskatchewan.

A native of Flesherton, Ont., Dr. Ferris obtained his degree from the Ontario Veterinary College at Guelph in 1935 when he joined the Branch's Meat Inspection Division at Toronto.

After a posting to Prince Edward Island, he returned to Toronto where he transferred to the Contagious Diseases Division. This was followed in 1938 by a move to Cornwall as veterinary inspector for the eastern Ontario area and in 1939 he was assigned to hog cholera control work in the western area of the province.

He was in charge of the New Liskeard sub-district office in 1941 and of the Windsor office in 1948.

After helping combat an outbreak of hog cholera in Quebec and eastern Ontario in 1960 Dr. Ferris moved to Toronto the following year with a promotion to assistant district veterinarian.

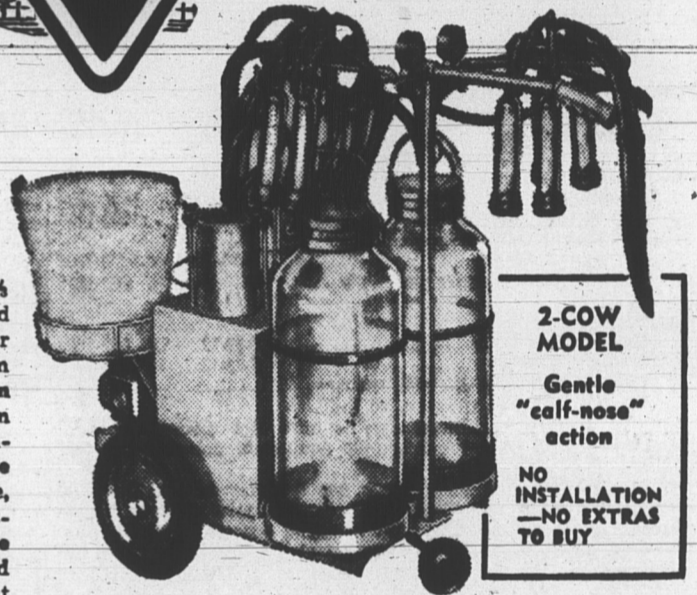

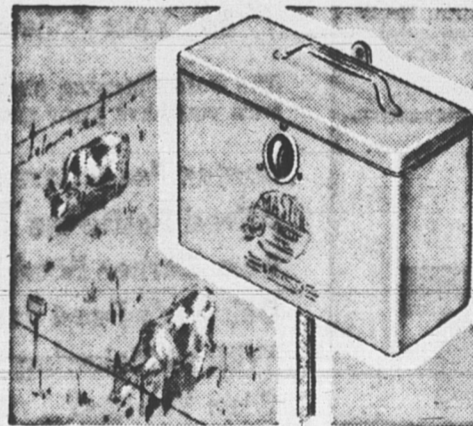
