HULL, England (CP)—A woman in this Yorkshire city has had more than 600 blood transfusions, and she expects to have one every two weeks for the foreseeable future.

Mrs. Barbara Longbone, 42, suffers from a form of anaemia which inhibits production of red corpuscles. Doctors have been unable to hold out hope of an early cure. The illness is believed to have resulted from war work in a London munitions factory.

She had her 664th transfusion in mid-June. In some 10 years she has received at least 2,000 pints of other people's blood.

## Ask Liquor Law Study—Hotelmen

MONCTON, N.B. (CP)—Maritime hotel operators are asking for a study of liquor laws if they are to get a larger share of the tourist business, delegates to the Canadian Tourist Association, Atlantic provinces section were told.

The meeting of restaurant, resort and hotel operators agreed that a survey of Nova Scotia's liquor laws by the Atlantic provinces economic council should be expanded to include New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island. John Fisher, CTA executive secretary, presiding at the conference, called Maritime liquor regulations "inane."

He said "the Maritimes are dragging behind the rest of the continent" (except for Saskatchewan and Alberta in respect to liquor laws).

British Columbia recently had "became emancipated" with opening of liquor stores in the evenings. A big reduction in bootlegging had resulted.

Ontario was still in the "dark ages" as far as liquor permits were concerned. Quebec got the biggest proportional share of tourist revenue because of its more liberal liquor laws.
