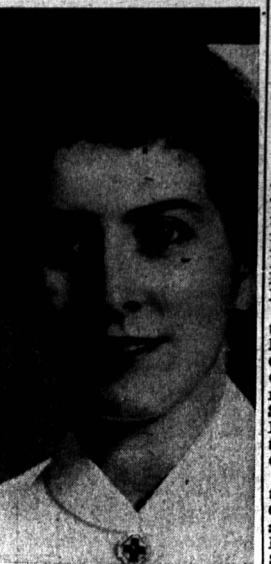

Miss Vida Jean Stewart, R.N., B. Th. daughter of Mr. and Mrs. C. Stewart, Malpeque Road, Charlottetown, is making preparation to enter medical missionary work at Kulpahar Mission Station, near Cawnpore, United Provinces, India.
 A member of Central Christian Church, she is being sent out by her local congregation, who have accepted the responsibility of her financial support while she is on the field. Miss Stewart plans her departure from Canada late this year. Before being assigned to the Kulpahar Station where she will be in charge of medical and dispensary duties, she will be required by the Indian government to take a six-month course in mid-wifery and spend some time in language study.
 Miss Stewart was a student of Prince of Wales College and graduated from the Prince Edward Island Hospital School of Nursing in 1951. She was a member of the staff of the P.E.I. Hospital before entering Alberta Bible College, Calgary, Alberta, from which she graduated in May with her Bachelor of Theology degree upon completion of four years of study there.
 Miss Stewart will speak at Central Christian Church Sunday morning, July 1st, and at various Churches of Christ in the Province and throughout the Maritimes in the near future. She will also attend the Canoe Cove Christian Camp as a faculty member while camps are in session throughout the month of July.
