## Gov't Receives First Payment Under ARDA

 The provincial government yesterday received its first cheque, for approximately \$15,000 from the federal government as part payment of the federal share on joint projects carried out under the Agricultural Rehabilitation and Development Program.

Premier Walter R. Shaw said the money is part of the federal cheque which is being used to carry out ARDA projects such as reforestation, building ponds and dams, the West Point beach development, and several research projects.

**PATTERN FOR OTHERS**  
 "Our resources development program is designed to lift the economic and social life of our people. I outlined some of the program during the last session of the Legislature, and I am happy to say that our development under ARDA is serving as a pattern for other provinces but other programs being made of the work we are doing."

"We are only in the initial stages of this program, and our division of research, under Harwood Daley, who has done an excellent job as director, administers not only the ARDA programs but other programs intimately associated with the organizations of the people in various parts of the province."

**SHAW COMMENTS**  
 Commenting on the first federal payment, the premier said "I am gratified, indeed, on receiving the first payment on the work carried out under ARDA. This amount, approximately \$15,000, is only a partial payment from Ottawa regarding a few initial projects which have been underway for some time. We anticipate that as our program develops, further payments will be made."

On other projects, the premier says half of the cost, and on others the federal government pays as high as 100 per cent.

## Opening of Ferry Service Delayed

The Wood Islands ferry service, operated by Northumberland Ferries Ltd., is unable to open on schedule because of ice conditions, Captain Claude Hunter, company president, said yesterday.

The run scheduled to start today, has been delayed by ice blocking the harbor on the Nova Scotia side for the third day in as many years.

"We definitely can't open today," said Captain Hunter in a telephone conversation with the headquarters of Ferguson Industries, Pictou, "but we are aiming at Friday or Saturday for our season's first crossing."

**BUOYS NOT PLACED**  
 Captain Hunter said that the weather bureau had placed only 24 buoys in the water, and that the possibility of beginning the season on Friday or Saturday depended on whether or not the transport department is able to get the buoys in position for the service.

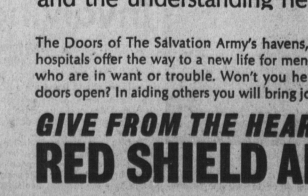
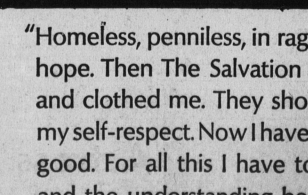
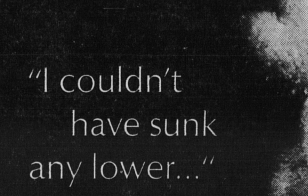
