

Symphony Enters Second Decade

Canada's only professional touring orchestra will visit Confederation Centre of the Arts on Friday, September 30 for an 8:30 p.m. performance featuring a brilliant Russian-born conductor.

The Atlantic Symphony Orchestra is the third deature production at the 1977 Fall Festival at Confederation Centre, under

the outstanding direction of Victor Yampolsky, former assistant conductor of the internationally-acclaimed Moscow Philharmonic.

Mr. Yampolsky leads the Atlantic Symphony in the full year of celebration in recognition of the orchestra's 10th anniversary. A spokesman for the Halifax-based symphony says the new conductor is leading

the orchestra into its second decade.

Mr. Yampolsky's background is wide and varied, a student of two major music figures at the Moscow Conservatory, and while still in his 20's, became assistant conductor of the Moscow Philharmonic.

Each year, the Atlantic Symphony Orchestra travels over 10,000 touring miles bringing outstanding music to the people of Atlantic Canada.

The orchestra spokesman said his organization is presenting "the most compelling programme of great artists and great music ever assembled in Atlantic Canada".

The Atlantic Symphony concert is the first in a series of three "Music Special" bargains at the 1977 Fall Festival at Confederation Centre of the Arts in downtown Charlottetown. Tickets are available at Confederation Centre Box Office or any Linkletter Travel Agency.
