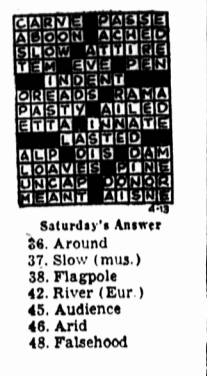

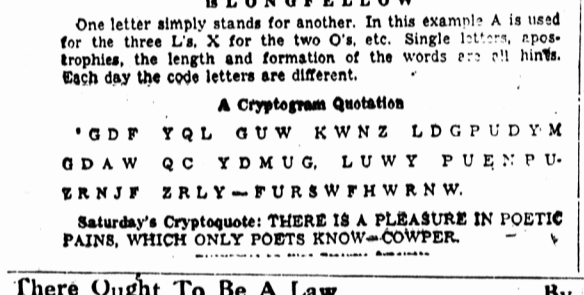

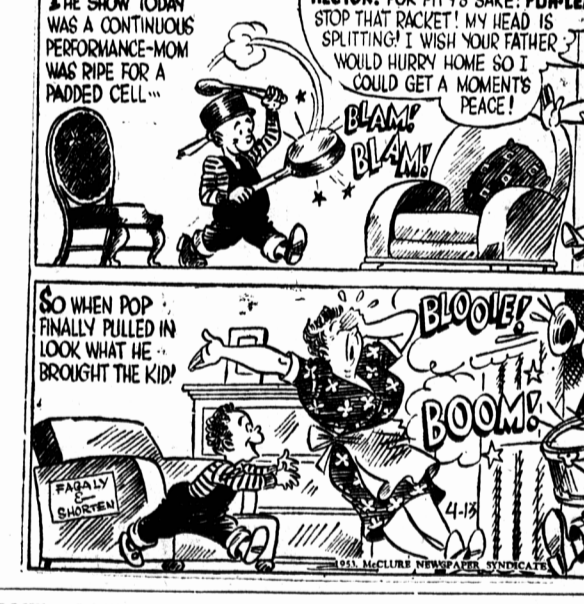

N.Y. Stocks Show Firmness Trend

NEW YORK, (AP)—The stock market showed a firmness trend for the first time in weeks, as the Dow Jones industrial average closed at 105.53, up 1.25 points from 104.28.

The market dropped to a new low for the year, steadied itself, and then quietly subsided. For the last two weeks the market has been under the influence of Communist peace gestures centered on the exchange of sick and wounded Korean war prisoners.

As a yardstick for last week's decline, The Associated Press average of 500 stocks fell 1.70. The previous week the fall was \$3.50, the heaviest since the week the Korean war started in 1950.

The most active issues last week on the New York stock exchange were Pepsi-Cola up 1 1/4 at 44 1/2 with 196,000 shares traded and Pacific Western Oil up 3/4 at 42 1/2.

Canadian issues were higher Friday. Hiram Walker was up 2 at 47, a reflection of a good earnings report. Also on the upside were McTear & Distillers Seagram both ahead 3/4, Dome Mines up 1/4 and Canadian Pacific advancing 1/2. International Nickel was not quoted.

On the American stock exchange Canadian issues were lower. Giant Yellowknife lost 1/2, Royaltie Oil eased 1/4 and Lake Shore added 1/4.
