

Yugoslav Takes Boston Marathon On First Try

BOSTON (CP) — Yugoslavia's Franjo Mihalic skinned along the hot asphalt like a burning match Saturday, winning the Boston Marathon the first time out.

The 36-year-old slightly bald student and painter took the challenge of the defending champion, Johnny Kelley of the United States, on the gruelling hills and emerged by far the strongest in

the race. There were 159 runners. Mihalic, impassive as a money-man intent on foreclosure, showed only slight sign of elation as he approached the finish line all alone, with steady, tall strides.

He swept from his head a sort of bandana he wore as protection from the blistering heat and tossed it to the crowd like a bride's bouquet.

Kelley, a 27-year-old Groton, Conn., teacher with a smile on his lips and a fighting glint in his eye, seemed satisfied to finish second after he could not hurt the Yugoslav on the stomach-wringing test of heartbreak hill near the end of the race.

Canada had 15 runners in the Marathon, including some who are comparative novices in long-distance racing and others who love the race merely for the sake of running. They won plaudits for a gritty performance although none finished in the top 10.

A touch of romance was injected into the proceedings when it became known that Mihalic, a student of physical education in Belgrade, is soon to be married to a geologist.

He captured the fifth Marathon of the six he has attempted in the two years he has been at it. In the Olympic Games in Australia he ran second to France's Alain Mimoun in scorching temperatures. Kelley also was entered in that race but gave up in the heat.

Mihalic, who developed his slim but powerful legs as a cyclist, finished Saturday in the time of two hours, 25 minutes and 54 seconds, well off the record. Kelley was more than a half-mile behind in 2:30:51.

The heat, touching more than 80 degrees over the pavement along the route, was a heart-breaker.

RECORD DISPUTED
Finland's Eino Pulkkinen was a third, well behind Kelley. Until last year the Boston record had been held by Pulkkinen's countryman, Antti Viskari, who ran the distance in 2:14:14 in 1946.

Later it was found that the Marathon course of years had

been short 1,800 yards. Last year Kelley won in cooler weather in 2:20:5 over the regulation Marathon distance. Of course, that stands as the record.

Tony Sapienza of Southbridge, Mass., ran fourth Saturday and Mexico's Pedro Peralta was fifth. It was an oddity of the race that Kelley, Mihalic and Pulkkinen, who frequently were found in that order at the head of the pack, carried the card Nos. 1, 2 and 3 respectively.

Roland Michaud, a 30-year-old Montreal plasterer, had the race-happy Bostonians agog in the early part of the Marathon when he pounded along strongly in fourth place, sometimes in third.

Later Michaud, who emigrated to Canada from France five years ago, admitted he went into action as he would in a race of shorter distance, since this was only his second attempt over the marathon length. He finished in 22nd place, wracked by cramps.

BEST-PLACED CANADIAN
There was something strikingly workmanlike about the swarthy Michaud, as he took proffered drinks from helpers and splashed them over his head, bathed in sweat, as he dashed along during the heat of the race.

Michaud's was the best Canadian placing in the race. Of a five-man team from the Toronto Gladstone Club, four finished. Bob Goldie placed 30th, George Norman 35th, vor Robb 38th and Albert Hay 49th. John Church was forced out after 20 miles by illness.

Doug Hare of Hamilton, formerly of Calgary, and Sid Smith, Burlington, Ont., and Hamilton, were not listed among the official

tered, his feet bleeding and his face was full of exhaustion—and pride.

There were their heart-tugging things in the Marathon.

Consider how Montreal's Gunnar Wahlberg crossed the finish line with a brave smile, then crept away to a quiet place and whimpered in agony, in the grip of an excruciating leg cramp.

Take the case of Toronto's Albert Hay, who is 40 and ran his first Marathon. He wouldn't talk to a reporter before the race—because of modesty—but hustled his wispy frame to the newspaper man afterwards and exulted:

"Well, I finished. Now ask me questions."

His running shoes were tat-
